<b>Organization Updates, Announcements</b>	<p><b>IMC</b> is conducting GBV case management through outreach activities in Village 5 and SGBV awareness sessions in coordination with Care International.</p> <p><b>Care International</b> initiated a new project on GBV case identification and referral through the involvement of CBOs in 6 locations of Mafraq and Zarqa governorates.</p> <p><b>JRF:</b> JRF started to provide case management in cooperation with Queen Rania Family and Child Centre in three areas (Maan, Alquwaysemeh and Karak) working with 3 CBOs.</p> <p><b>UNHCR:</b> The government will issue MOI cards for children born in Syria with no documentation based on UNHCR's asylum seeker status and documentation.</p> <p><b>UNICEF</b> initiated a process of the update of the referral pathways of the Interagency SOPs for CP and SGBVCP/GBV. <b>IASC GBV guidelines roll out process</b>	<p>Jordan is one of the 11 priority countries for the roll out of the inter-agency SGBV guidelines. Following are the agreed priority sectors for the rollout of the guidelines: Education, Protection, Livelihood and Cash, Shelter, Wash and Camp Coordination, The rollout is planned between 13-24/11/2016. <b>16 Days of Activism initial plan</b>	The focus of the 16 days of activism this year will be Violence against Women/Gender based Violence. Members were requested to share their planned activities with the SGBV-SWG so that these can be translated into the joint calendar of activities to be developed by UN Women. At present, the UN Communication Group (UNCG) is in the process of developing a concept note for the campaign. <b>Presentation: 2016 Urban Refugee Assessment Findings (CARE)</b>	Care International presented the key findings of their annual assessment 'Six Years into Exile.' The assessment is based on interviews with 1,603 Syrian refugee households in urban areas of Jordan, as well as 471 Jordanian citizens. Protection and SGBV related findings of the assessment were discussed in the meeting. <b>UNHCR regional study 'Sexual Violence against Men'</b>	UNHCR MENA Protection Service is planning to conduct a study on sexual violence against refugee men and boys, as a follow up on the outcome and recommendations from the regional workshop on working with male survivors of sexual violence that took place last year. The study will be carried out in Jordan, Lebanon, and Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KRI), targeting refugees in urban, peri-urban, rural and camp setting. The study will explore the experiences of men survivors of sexual violence and ascertain the gaps in the provision of the services to provide recommendations in the region.
