	• Core principles to harmonize the employment services: confidentiality, equity, free	
	services, durable solutions among others.	
	 Main services of Employment Service Centers: registration of job seekers and 	
	vacancies, job matching and placement, active labour market programmes as well as	
	labour market information and analysis. These centers are based at the Ministry of	
	Labour directorates as well as in both camps.	
	 Since opening the 11 ESCs, 3,000 Syrian and Jordanian job seekers have been 	
	registered, out of which 781 have been placed in jobs during the period of September-	
	December 2017.	
_	E-Counselling system	
	 The ILO e-counselling system is a unified system that connects Syrian and Jordanian 	
	job seekers, employment service and training providers, and private sector employers	
	through intranet and telecom infrastructure.	
	 Main Beneficiaries: Syrian and Jordanian Job seekers, as well as private sector 	
	companies and employers in general.	
	 In 3-5 years, this system will be ultimately handed over to the MoL based on their 	
	capabilities and technical requirements. Initial year will be using the Cloud	
	application.	
	 Job and training seekers are registered in a common data base shared by service 	
	providers for jobs, training, permits, potential employers and other job search sites

-	UNHCR updates:	
	• UNHCR will be adapting the targeting of cash assistance to new criteria. A communication	
	strategy will address rotation from cash. SMSs (currently being fine-tuned) will be sent	
	out to identify refugees to encourage them to participate in livelihoods projects.	
	• UNHCR receives 70-100 helpline calls per month with questions on employment, training	
	and business support. Livelihoods unit in UNHCR does the case management and referral.	
	 Periodic analysis on work permits is forthcoming.

 A National Conference launched the Jordanian Sector Skills Team <u>E-TVET</u>, GIZ, MoL on May 15th, 2018. The ministry of Labour is working on a package of amendments in line with the needs of the labour market by addressing negative perceptions of TVET and promoting enrolment in vocational schools. During the launch, MoL discussed challenges related to the number of stakeholders and lack of coordination. Goal is to reach 45% Tvet graduates by 2025.
