


#### Refugees (individuals) by age and Camp in Charge gender breakdown (Source: RRRC/UNHCR)



#### Trend of new arrivals (individuals) in 2018 (Source: RRRC/UNHCR)





#### Trend of new arrivals (individuals) in 2018 (Source: RRRC/UNHCR)






