The project targets the northern region where water reserves are under extreme pressure. It also focuses on enhancing the private sector role through adopting a Market System Development (MSD) approach. At this point, we are focusing on the House Hold (HH) component of the project by providing grey water systems and rain water harvesting tanks through a revolving fund system in northern parts of Jordan. We are also in the process of securing final USAID approval on three large scale communal water projects that includes major rehabilitation of two dams and a water catchment pond.
