





Feedbacks received from the community

- Community members were dissatisfied about the new IBV system because it is not practical to visit each NGO to register for IBV and complained that personal relationships will be the main requirement to get a job.
- Community members reported that the IBV new procedures is not clear, and they requested to more clarification by UNHCR.
- Community members said that NGOs working in Azraq Camp should include PWD in their IBV activities.
