

Somalia

1 - 31 January 2020

In January, 35,000 new internal displacements were monitored by the UNHCR-led Protection and Returns Monitoring Network (PRMN). Drivers include conflict and insecurity (28,000), droughtrelated (6,000), and other reasons (1,000).



As of the reporting month, there were 35,685 refugees and asylum-seekers registered in Somalia, mainly from Ethiopia (17,508 asylum seekers and 4,268 refugees) and Yemen (55 asylum seekers and 13,238 refugees). 626 persons were from other countries including Syria (266), Tanzania (121), Eritrea (108) among others.





Number of activities by region and category


