# COLOMBIA RESPONSE



Save the Children

**16th - 28th March 2020**

Since 2018, Save the Children Colombia has given response to the Venezuelan Migratory crisis in fourth departments in the country: Two in the border with Venezuela (La Guajira and Arauca) and two urban centers that host the highest number of Venezuelan migrants and Colombian returnees (Bogotá D.C, and Cali with part of its neighboring municipalities). Also, in 2019 with protection and education in emergencies attention in the department of Nariño.

Given the SARS-CoV2 (also known as COVID-19 or Coronavirus), our activities have been adapted to respond to the pandemic, by supporting other key sectors to continue their activities, other agencies, and mainly local hospitals and health authorities, and local governments to complement and strengthen their responses.

## STAFF

The national team was invited to the first Health Webinar, led by the team from the Guajira Medical Unit, in prevention and mitigation of COVID 19 and permanent attention of the line "care of the caregiver"



## WASH

**10.711** people, including boys and girls, received hygiene kits and messages on the prevention of COVID-19.

Distribution of water in different informal settlements of Maicao, we reached **3479** people who have been able to benefit from this activity.



## HEALTH

**445** consultations for prenatal, postnatal control, newborn care, family planning, general, mental health and psychosocial support in the Maicao Unit. **11** of them with acute respiratory symptoms.



## CASH

**63** pregnant and lactating mothers phone calls about breastfeeding counseling, handwashing, and COVID-19 care and prevention

**700** new enrollments to the cash program.



## Education and Protection

**8457** people participated in the delivery of brochures and posters on the prevention of COVID-19, including communication with protection committees in different areas of the country.



To benefit **65,000** people with our COVID-19 response programs in Arauca, Bogotá, Guajira, Norte de Santander and Valle, we require USD **3,800,000**
