
## Internal Displacements Monitored by Protection & Return Monitoring Network (PRMN) June 2020




The UNHCR-led PRMN implemented in partnership with NRC reported 36,000 new internal displacements in the month of June 2020. Of these, 17,000 were triggered by conflict/insecurity, 9,000 by floods and 8,000 related to drought or lack of livelihoods.



#### BY REGION (Jan - Jun 2020) DEP






### CONFLICT / INSECURITY DISPLACEMENTS

Major displacements (12,000) continue in Marka and Wanla Weyn districts of Lower Shabelle region, as a result of the ongoing military campaign against Al Shabaab. In addition, some 4,000 individuals were displaced in Cabudwaaq district of Galgaduud region due to clan conflict in the district.








During the month of June, Bay (2,000) and Bari (2,000) regions were the most affected by new displacements where the main reason given was lack of livelihoods.

## FLOOD DISPLACEMENTS



From the 18th of June 2020 River Shabelle flooded and affected 25 villages in Balcad district of Middle Shabelle region. Several houses were submerged, and hectors of farming lands covered by water. Most of the population affected are small-scale


farmers, livestock producers and traders. The key priority needs include shelter, food, safe drinking water, mosquito nets and hygiene services.
