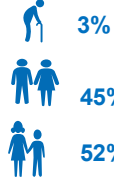

OBJECTIVE: Risk of SGBV reduced and quality of response improved

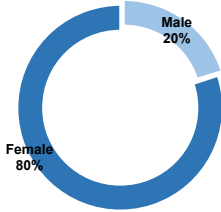

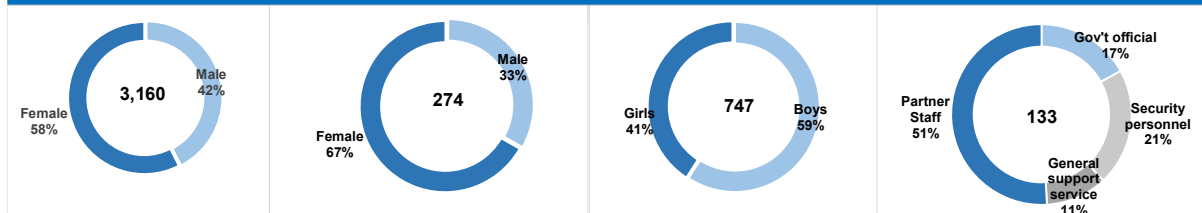
SGBV INCIDENTS BY GENDER



- 18% of the survivors are minors
- 57% of the survivors are adult female
- 20% of the survivors are adult male
- 2% of the survivors are elderly
- 3% of the survivors are persons with disability
- 11% of the incidents are from Host community
- 10% of the incidents are from integrated community in Taraba state
- 12% of the incidents are from Benue state
- 67% of the incidents are from Cross River state

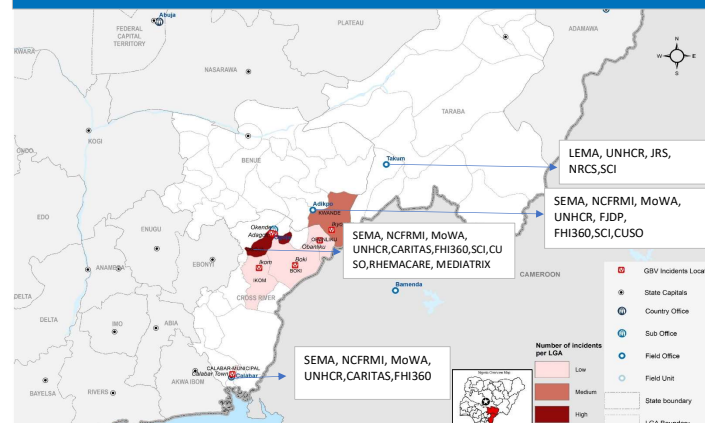
