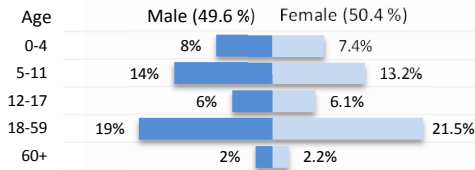

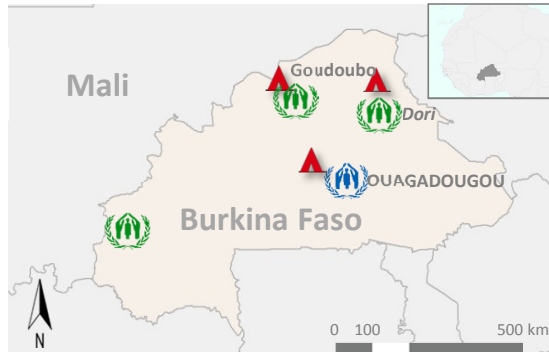

Context

History Goudoubo was established in October 2012 to host refugees from camps located too close to the border. Goudoubo is an ideal location due to its proximity to Dori as well as far distance from the Malian border. The camp is one of the three permanent sites and has a capacity to host 21,000 refugees. The camp is organized in blocks, islets and lots.

Women under-represented in camp structures

High malnutrition rates at 24,5%

Protection Responses

Women's committee formed by **IEDA-Relief** to address women's issues.

Save the Children put in place community-based response mechanisms.

Plan Burkina has constructed 24 additional classrooms.

Oxfam has trained WASH refugee promoters for community-based campaigns.

Income generation (**IEDA/TDH**) and animal husbandry (**FAO/VSF**) activities ongoing.

Plan Burkina has established various child-friendly spaces with education activities.

OCADES/Caritas distributes wood and is constructing energy efficient stoves.

Host communities included in the assistance planning thanks to **HELP-Germany**.

Targetted awareness campaigns for men, adolescents and families introduced.

Danish Refugee Council conducting protection monitoring for refugees living outside of camp and in border regions.
