


United Nations Country Team in Turkey Daily Situation Report on the Situation Pertaining to Syria

July 9, 2012

It has been reported officially that as of July 9, 2012 total camp population is **37,353** with the arrival of 303 and return of 171 persons on July 8-9, 2012.

Total number of registered persons from December 16, 2011 to July 9, 2012 is reflected below.




Currently arrivals from Syria are assisted in the border provinces of Hatay, Gaziantep, Kilis and Şanlıurfa.

As of July 9, 2012 the city breakdown in the region is as follows:

- Hatay population*: 7,999 individuals
- Gaziantep population in Islahiye[†]: 6,145 individuals
- Kilis population in Öncüpınar container site: 11,498 individuals
- Şanlıurfa population in Ceylanpınar: 11,493 individuals
- In Hospitals: 218 individuals (195 patients+23 companions)

Population movement from Hatay to Gaziantep (Islahiye Camp), Kilis (Öncüpınar Container site) and Şanlıurfa (Ceylanpınar), from March 15^{\ddagger} to July 9, 2012 is reflected below.

1. Highlights:

^{*:} The population of the Kuyubaşı/Karbeyaz, Yayladağı 2 (YIBO) and Reyhanlı camps in Hatay is moved to Islahiye camp in Gaziantep and to Öncüpınar container site in Kilis. It has been reported that these empty camps will be kept for while as standby and there is some use of these camps for new arrivals.

[‡] 15 March is the date of first movement took place from Hatay.

- From May 24 to July 4, 2012 there has been an increase of 51 % in total number of Syrians currently provided temporary protection by Turkish Government.
- Newly arrived persons are continued to be transferred to the Ceylanpınar Camp in Şanlıurfa and the current population of the camp is **11,493** persons.
