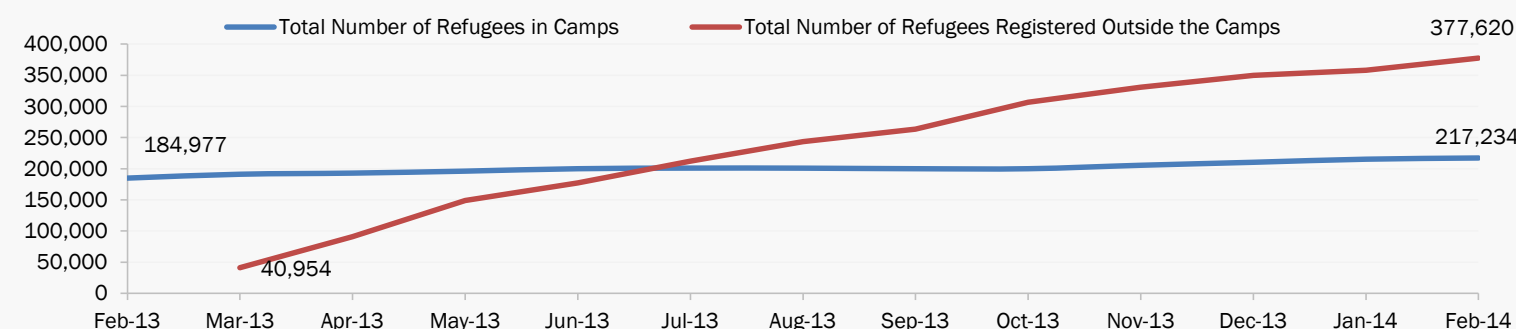

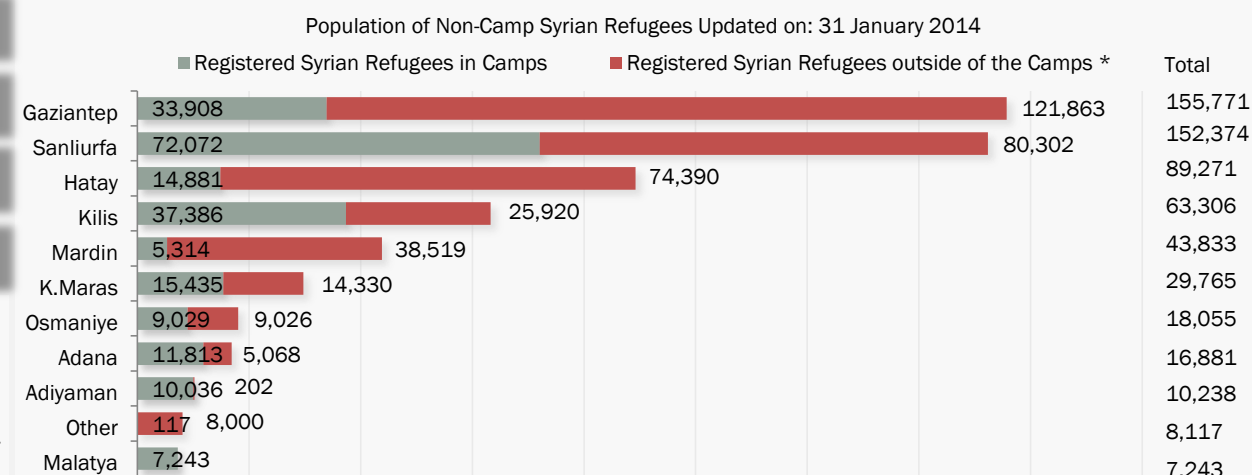

Highlights

- On 05 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 217,237 including 117 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 04-05 Feb 2014, a total of 383 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 356 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis UNHCR Field team was informed by unofficial sources that during the last 10 days to two weeks a few thousand Syrians have taken busses from Kilis city to other provinces, like Istanbul, Gaziantep, Adana etc. The local gendarmerie informed UNHCR of a few thousands of Syrians crossing to Turkey through unofficial border crossing points using smugglers.
- UNHCR Field Team visited the boarding school where according to government officials over 150 Syrians were temporarily accommodated who were picked up at the bus station. The school staff informed that they had had transferred about 212 Syrians to Nusaybin camp on 05 Feb. 2014. It was also reported that on the way the bus will stop in Elbeyli to pick up 30 more Syrians who approached the camp to be admitted.
- In Osmaniye, the local officials reported that they have also observed that the number of non-camp Syrians in Osmaniye city is also increasing. The local officials' estimation for the non-camp Syrians is about 17,000 and majority of them are Turkmen origin. Osmaniye camp shelters Turkmen and it is believed that this is an important reason for many Turkmen to prefer to go to Osmaniye.
- In Mardin, the local authorities informed that AFAD is considering to build a new camp in one of the towns of Mardin province which would be the 3rd camp in Mardin. The new camp is planned to be similar to the one in Nusaybin; rub hall type tents divided into 8 sections - one per family. The plan is to put 10 rub halls with 8 sections in each and another rub hall as communal kitchen.
- AFAD Officials in Mardin also informed that the mobile registration which was sent to Nusaybin camp will be deployed to Batman province to register the non-camp Syrians there. In Sept. 2013, the dept. governor of Batman stated to media that it is estimated that there are about 2,600 families (approx: 10,000) of non-camp Syrian living in Batman.
