



## Highlights

- On 05 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 223,641 persons. AFAD reported that during the period of 04-06 April 2014, a total of 880 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,509 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- It was reported in the national media that a group of 18 elderly Syrian men and women of Armenian origin, fleeing from Keseb town of Syria across Yayladagi town arrived in Turkey on 06 April 2014. Reportedly the group was met by the local authorities including the sub-governor of Yayladagi at the border and were all placed in a teachers guesthouse in Yayladagi after having medical checks. Since the fights started in Keseb town last week, there has been no significant influx to Turkey.
- On 06 April 2014, it was reported in the media that Azaz town across Kilis border gate was bombed by the Syrian Government. UNHCR has been on contact with the local authorities for a possible influx to Turkey, however as per information from the local authorities in Kilis, so far no influx was reported.
- UNHCR was informed that there is an informal school run by Syrian teachers in Kiziltepe town of Mardin, which is reportedly supported by national and international NGOs together with the SASF. Reportedly there are 497 Syrian children attending the school. The UNHCR Team was informed that SASF provided school uniforms, and transportation to the children to/from home to schools. It was also reported that 15 Syrian teachers are working in the school and they are provided 700 TL per month (500 by NGOs and 200 by SASF).
- UNHCR was informed by local officials that there is an increasing number of non-camp Syrians in Konya. Officials stated that they have so far registered around 13,000 Syrians while their estimation is that there are around 30,000 non-camp Syrians living in Konya province.
