149,327 Individuals

provided with assistance in May



49,640 individuals were temporarily provided with drinking water (23,910 in Togdheer, 22,440 in Lower Juba, 2,400 in Sanaag and 890 in Sool regions).



48,348 individuals benefited from Core Relief Items. 12,651 plastic sheets were distributed to 12,651 households (22,651 individuals) in Bay, Sool, Woqooyi Galbeed and Sanaag regions

4,006 CRI kits were distributed to 4,006 households (24,197 individuals) in Sool, Lower Juba and Banadir regions; 250 family tents (1,500 individuals) were distributed in Sool and Sanaag regions.



41,408 individuals benefited from an established supply of potable water and improved sanitation and hygiene conditions through the construction of 120 twin latrines and the distribution of 102 waste disposal kits in Bay region.



1,550 households were provided with one-time unconditional cash grant in amount of US\$ 100, benefiting to 8,530 individuals in Mudug region.




1,401 individuals were reached with Gender Based Violence interventions through 550 dignity kits in Mudug region and 851 participants to awareness raising sessions in Bay region.

Situation overview


From 1 to 31 May, UNHCR's Protection & Returns Monitoring System (PRMN), recorded around 46,000 individuals nationwide displaced by the drought, bringing the total of drought driven displaced since November 2016 to 739,000 The number of newly displaced by the drought has decreased significantly compared to previous months (April: 131,000, March: 278,000). Baidoa and Mogadishu remain two of the most affected areas with 4,900 and 9,000 new arrivals in May

Some 7,700 IDP returns were recorded during the month primarily from IDP sites in Baidoa town to home locations within Baidoa district and elsewhere in Bay region.


Breakdown of assistance during May 2017
