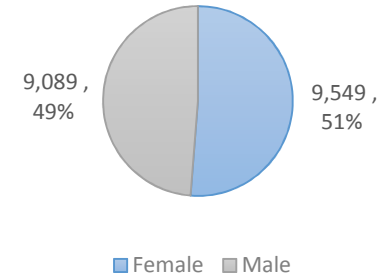
Cohorts - Structured PSS

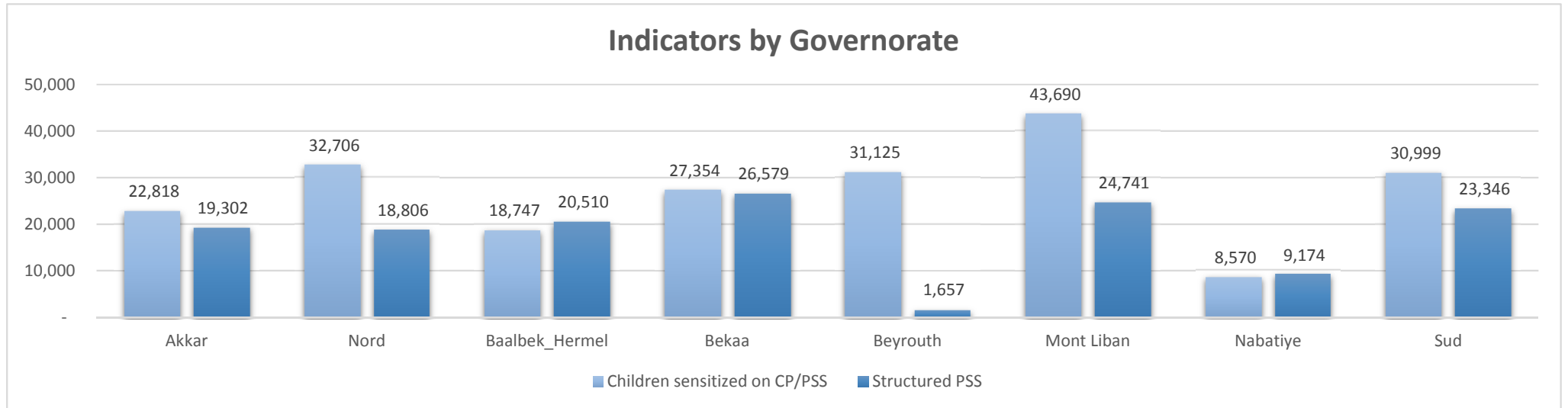

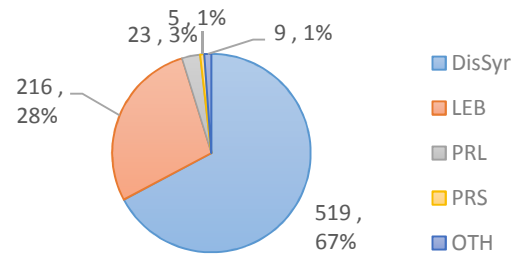

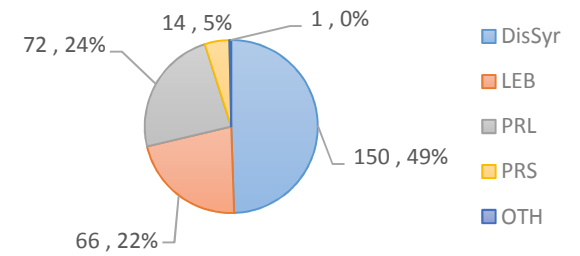
Focused PSS - Cohorts



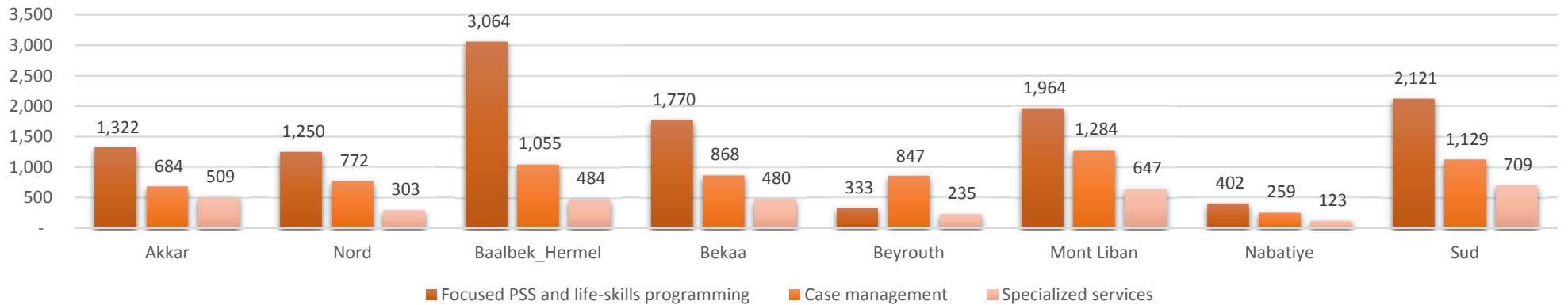

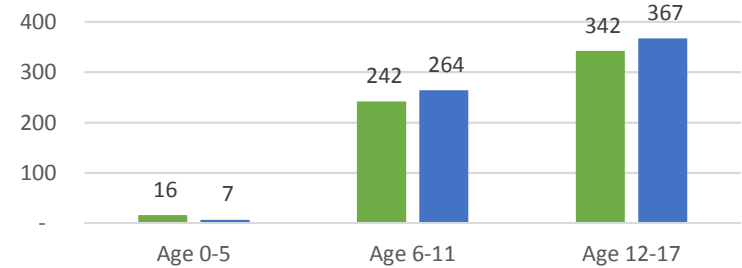

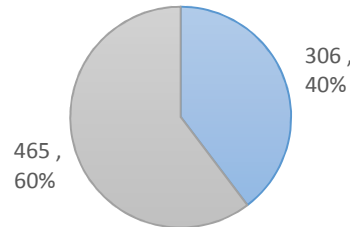

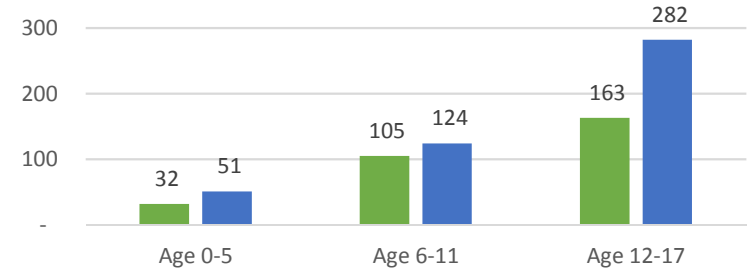

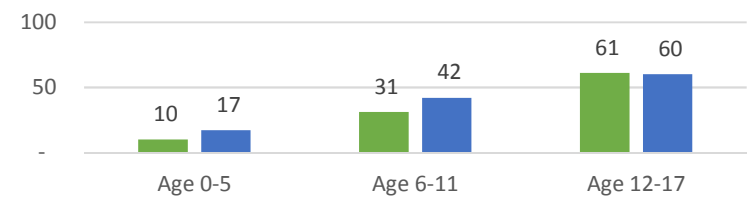
