Camp Management Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> During the monthly meeting between CMC and Camp Management team, the CMC raised the issues of shelter condition in the camp, the shortage of health services available for the camp and the lack of food ration for new born babies. The matter of shelter condition has been referred to Shelter Cluster/UNHCR and as soon as feedback is received the CM team will update the CMC. The CM team initiated discussion with CMC regarding IDPs movements to and from Maw Thi Ngar

SCI food distribution conducted for both TKP and MTN on February 9th, food package includes Rice, Pulse, Oil and Salt for a total of 13, 505 IDPs.
