



During the reported period, Private Sector Partnership with Malaika; an export company for refined handicraft products, have been developed and is operational. The company has recruited 12 refugee women upon having a group of 16 trained on high quality embroidery. As part of the coordination role, livelihood team conducted several visits to operational and implementing partners to map out livelihood activities for 2018 interventions. This activity will enhance and inform the coordination mechanism among livelihood actors for the upcoming year.

ILO is planning to conduct a TOT for financial education to Egyptians and vulnerable groups. For this, 4 livelihood OPs and IPs participated in the ILO validation workshop that will support the preparation for the TOT. Selected trainers will be trained by ILO experts.

Continued working on sectoral intervention mainly for food sector and shaping the intervention in this sector through field visits to food projects and discussions with marketing companies and with agencies and entities working on the sector. This yielded a draft TOR for this planned intervention.

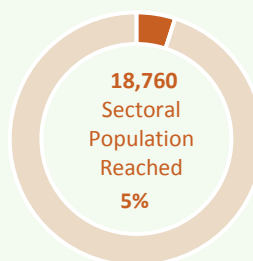

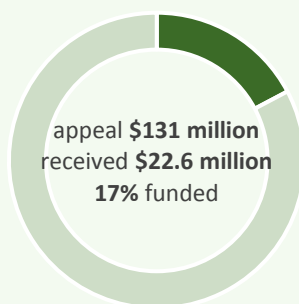
113,000 Syrian Refugees expected by end-2017



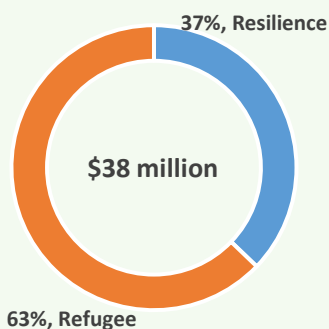
378,407 Refugees & Local Community Members Sectoral Target by end of 2017



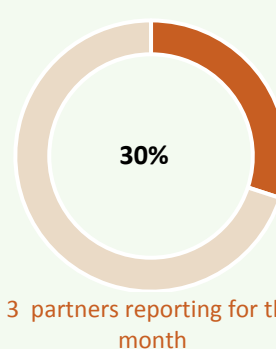
3RP 2017 Funding Status
