I. Updates	<p><b>4-5 years old (FE/VIAL RIC):</b> The REC informed that children received ADYM (student's personal health card) by SMH doctors. Parents were involved in the process, discussing with the teachers and the doctors about their kids development.</p> <p><b>6-11 years old (NFE/VIAL RIC):</b> On an average, 75 children attend the classes on a regular basis (5 days per week). On Friday, 9 March, 53 parents took part in the first parent's meeting. Parents agreed with METAdrasi's Education focal point that we need to emphasize on the need for a continuous collaboration between the teaching staff and the parents, through such meetings.</p> <p><b>6-11 years old (FE/off-site):</b> The REC informed that the School Advisors (Elementary Education) organize an in-service training for the teachers of Reception Classes on 14 March. Chios Director of Primary Education has submitted to the Prefecture a list of children who need to be transported to school. The list was provided by UNHCR.</p> <p><b>12-17 years old (FE/off-site):</b> The following issues have not been resolved yet:</p>	<p>Advocacy efforts will be focused on secondary education.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Inefficient number of ZEP Reception Classes at Gymnasiums</li> <li>- Lack of teaching staff at EPAL</li> <li>- Transportation issues</li> <li>- Low attendance for UAC residing in METAdrasi's shelter (1 out of 16 attending school), which could be related to the issues described above. Further exploration is needed.</li> </ul> <p><b>12-22 years old (NFE/VIAL RIC):</b> Action for Education count 200 attendances per week at the Learning Centre and the Youth Centre in Chios city (150 participants in total). They continue registering adolescents/youth every Thursday, between 10.00-10.30am at the RIC's entrance.</p> <p><b>18+ years old (NFE/VIAL RIC and off-site):</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <i>Athena Centre for Women:</i> No updates.</li> <li>- <i>Imagine Centre:</i> There are some changes in the schedule. Some women are referred to Athena Centre for classes, but there are mixed classes as well. The English language classes are organized according to the different levels of competence.</li> <li>- <i>CESRT Language Centre:</i> 125 people have registered for classes. Two classes have been established and 50 people attend regularly (10-15 of whom are women). Registrations are ongoing and there is eligibility for more classes to be established.</li> </ul> <p><b>* Abbreviations</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- FE: Formal Education</li> <li>- NFE: Non-Formal Education</li> <li>- RIC: Reception and Identification Centre</li> </ul>	<p>The REC will visit METAdrasi's shelter to meet children and discuss about relevant issues.</p> <p>AfE requested for RIC population breakdown, which UNHCR will provide.</p> <p>The REC can provide material for the Greek language lessons addressed to adults.</p>

AOB	<p>Request for a training on how to deal with emotional difficulties and ensure primary response to panic attacks and manifestation of PTSD symptoms at a school setting.</p> <p>Request by UNHCR for education providers to monitor and report on girls'/women's attendance.</p>	The REC will communicate with the Child and Adolescent's Centre in Chios to explore if they can offer the training.
