

The TVET training is demand driven, and through our partners we collaborate with the private sector across different sectors to facilitate access to employment.



- UNICEF has developed a vulnerability criteria in order to reach the most vulnerable youth in Jordan.
 - Demographics
 - Social vulnerability
 - Social Assistance/Livelihood
 - Health
 - Living Conditions
 - NEET
- Through UNHCR we were able to reach almost 2500 across Jordan through SMS and community sessions
