Highlights:

Access:

- Universities have reduced tuition fees for Syrian refugees by 50%. According to Central Admission Department, any reduction of the higher education fees is up to universities to decide.
- The Coursera free online study platform for refugees started to accept applications from refugee students in Iraq who want to study various courses provided by Coursera partner universities.

Quality:

- Teacher development training sessions were conducted for 96 teachers working in refugee camps.
- In June, Parent Teacher Associations (PTA) were supported to hold their regular meetings at eight refugee schools.

System Strengthening:

- Humanitarian partners supported the Directorate of Education (DoE) of Sulaymaniyah to provide transportation to 935 refugee children in 7 schools through hiring of 25 buses.

NEEDS ANALYSIS

- The funding gap is expected to affect payment of refugee teachers' incentives. There is need for advocacy and coordination among cluster partners to raise funds for the next academic year



A cumulative 1,018 out of the targeted 1,234 teachers have received incentives since January 2018
