Social Protection: key definitions

Glossary as agreed by the HCT Cash Taskforce in Lebanon

Social Protection: a set of nationally owned policies and instruments that provide income support and facilitate access to goods and services at minimally accepted levels.

- The overall aim is to protect them from deprivation and minimize social exclusion, particularly during periods of insufficient income, incapacity or inability to work.
- Social protection is often aligned with the Social Protection Floor concept.



Country profile

- Small country: 10,452 km² mainly urban
- ✓ Upper middle income; economy based on services
 - Social services highly privatized: education and health
 - Not signatory:1951 Refugee Convention, 1967 Protocol
 - Restrictions on labor for refugees

Political, legal, and economic restrictions that limit refugees from developing resilience to shocks.

Refugees face increased challenges to access basic goods and services available in the market.



Multifaceted vulnerability is developed over time.

Currently being tackled by sector based responses through activities (services + assistance).

There is a need to rethink the framework for action and connect with other stakeholders (development).



Understanding vulnerability from the targeting approach



Sectors that observe this approach:

Protection

Basic Assistance

Food Security

Socio-economic

Socio-economic is usually based on vulnerability proxies (i.e. expenditures, or dependency ratio etc..) could be data driven or based on case management



Where vulnerability is geographical pronounced (site level or cadastral level) targeting is based on a set of indicators – observed through assessments

A classical targeting approach that looks into specific profiles, demographic features: children, school aged children, women, elderly...





- Look closer at current targeting practices within the sectors to find ways to better align
- Decide on key activities/services that will need to continue and which should be strengthened
- Identify gaps in the current services that we would like to develop within an IA context
- Articulate a package of services for different profiles within the population and get a sense on what those services would look over time (i.e. in the context of return)
- Looking at complementarity of assistance → how to better track achievements?
