

# **Aegean Islands Weekly Snapshot**

#### **Arrivals**

This week, 598 people arrived on the Aegean islands, a decrease from last week's 658 arrivals and from last year's 839 arrivals during the same period.

The average daily arrivals this week equalled 85, compared to 94 in the previous week.

### Population on the Islands

Over 14,600 refugees and migrants reside on the Aegean islands. The majority of the population on the Aegean islands are from Afghanistan (36%), Iraq (17%) and Syria (12%).


Women account for 21% of the population and children for 30% of whom nearly 7 out of 10 are younger than 12 years old.


Approximately 20% of the children are unaccompanied or separated, mainly Afghan and Syrian.

Some 43% are men between 18 and 39 years old.


## **Entry Points by Sea**

This week, 598 people reached the Aegean islands, the majority of whom arrived to Samos. The average daily arrivals on all islands was 85.





### Departures to the mainland

This week, 1,184 asylum-seekers departed, once authorized by the authorities, from the Aegean islands to the mainland. Of those, 1,021 (86%) were transferred – with the support of UNHCR – to open reception facilities/sites and UNHCR's accommodation in apartments on the mainland.
