USAID Jordan Local Enterprise Support Project (LENS): Enabling Environment for HBBs

- The presentation showed the work *LENS* has been doing with Home Based Businesses (HBBs) for the past 5 years with an estimated budget of USD 65 million.
- *Lens* provides different types of support, namely: Supply side development, training on health and safety, equipment purchasing, financial literacy and packaging analysis. In addition, they aid in licencing facilitation, legal advisory service, HBB awareness programs and food testing and certifications.
- The project *Lens* worked on in Jordan was to ensure the economic growth of the Jordanian market. They [*Lens*] have established that the food processing sector is the most difficult to work in, however, it is a huge market in Jordan.
- The project employed several models to study the Jordanian market by working with HBBs and supporting local production with buyers.
- *Lens* has provided trainings in collaboration, learning adaptation and market integration for Syrian and Jordanian HBB owners to help them understand the nature of the food market. *Lens* is additionally willing to share a manual on HBB guidelines with partners once compiled.
- *Lens* highlighted the registration and licencing process over the past 4 years, and their work in the facilitation process after it has been made legal to licence and register.
- *Lens* highlighted the importance in finding buyers and finding a market for the product as an initial step.
- *Lens* have their own HBB facility in which they organize regular training sessions for HBB owners.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Lens</i> showcased their projects alongside IRC to support Syrians and Jordanians' HBBs which concluded in November. A new project will be launching soon to work with 407 HBBs in the food, sales and marketing sectors. • Challenges faced: 1. Licencing in Aqaba is still impossible. • Take away notes from <i>Lens</i>: always profile the customer. Find a market for the product before licencing a HBB.
