
SITUATION OVERVIEW


Over 741,000 Rohingya refugees have fled violence from Myanmar's Rakhine state since August 2017 and are hosted in Bangladesh. Most of the refugees rely on humanitarian assistance, having left with few possessions and exhausted their financial resources during the journey.

More than 910,000 Rohingya refugee women, men, girls and boys are hosted in Cox's Bazar District, including 34,172 registered refugees who arrived in the 1990s (4%); and other unregistered Rohingya refugees who had settled in host communities prior to August 2017. Children make up 55% of the total refugee population and women and girls make up 52%. One in three refugee families have at least one easily identifiable protection vulnerability. Whilst the pace of arrivals has decreased, refugees continue to arrive in Bangladesh, as of end of April 2019.

The dashboard monitor the monthly achievements of selected indicators from the 2019 country operation plan for each strategic area of activity with cumulative key figures and monthly highlights.






ACHIEVEMENT (APRIL 2019)

- 86,830 refugees have participated in the joint Government of Bangladesh-UNHCR registration exercise in this reporting month.
- **1,160** refugees received legal counselling while **113** advocacy interventions for the promotion and protection of refugee rights have been concluded in this reporting month.
- 246 refugees with disabilities received specific support, 3,230 refugees with specific need have received non-cash support and 1,323 PSN* have been referred in this reporting month.
- 4,291 complaints received under the community-based complaints mechanism and 3 new community groups have been supported in this reporting month.
- 497 members of community-based child protection structures have been trained while 154 UASCs have been indientified and documented in this reporting month.
- **196** partners, government and UNHCR staff have been trained on SGBV prevention and response while 518 survivors of SGBV incidents received psychosocial counselling in this reporting month.



109 WASH facilities have been maintained including, 11 tube wells and 104 latrines as of April 2019



KEY FIGURES 7 kilometers of roads and pathways, 13 kilometers of drainage, 9 kilometers of retaining structures, 8.6 cilometers of steps and 0.7 kilometers of bridges constructed







ACHIEVEMENT (APRIL 2019)

- 5.5 kilometers of infrastructures constructed in this reporting month, including **5.4** km of roads and pathways and 0.1 km of bridges.
- 4.382 partial shelter kits provided in this reporting month while 1,453 transitional shelters have been constructed last year.
- 44,716 pre-monsoon shelter tie-down kits and 467 shelter padlocks distributed in this reporting month.
