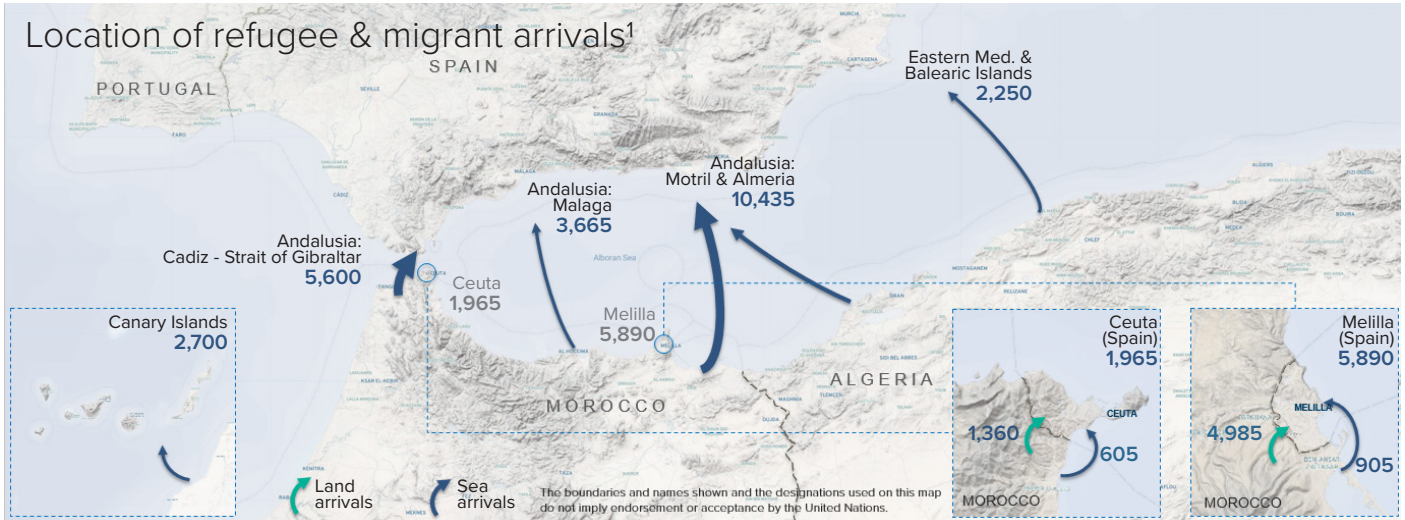

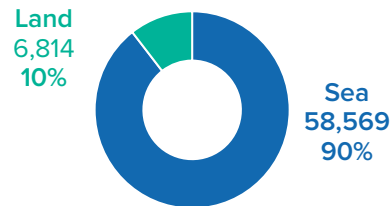
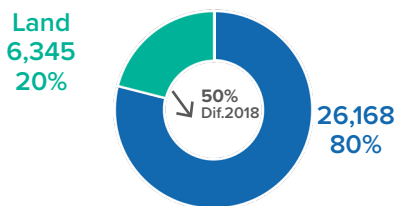

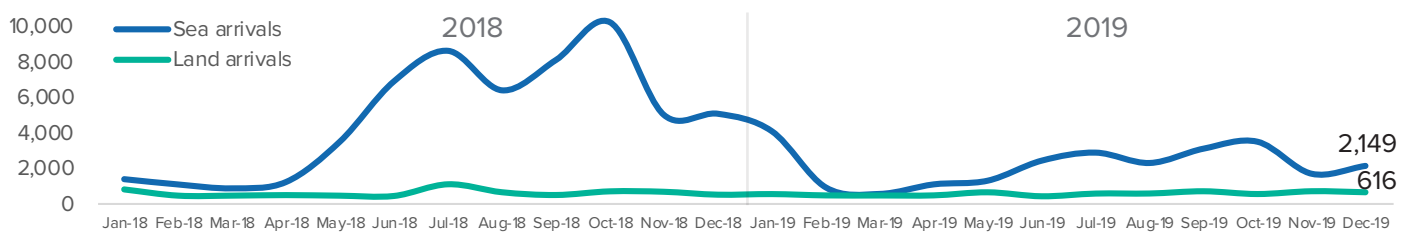

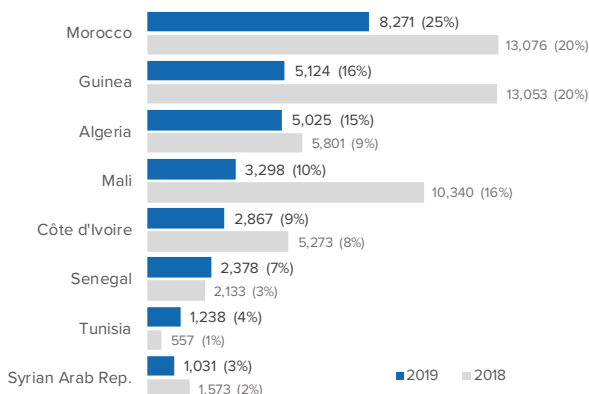

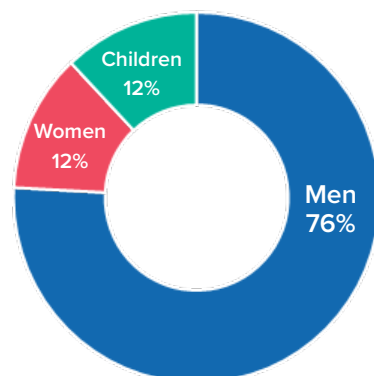
Arrivals trend by month

The figures depicted here do not include arrivals to Spain by air.

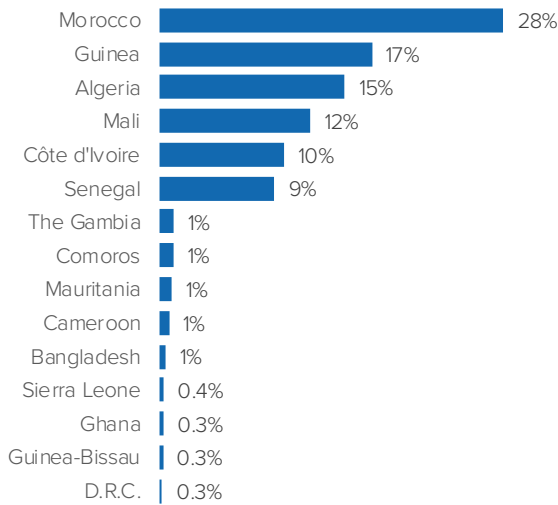

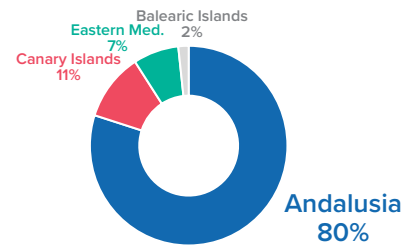

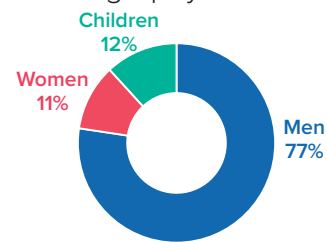
Most common nationalities



Arrivals by region

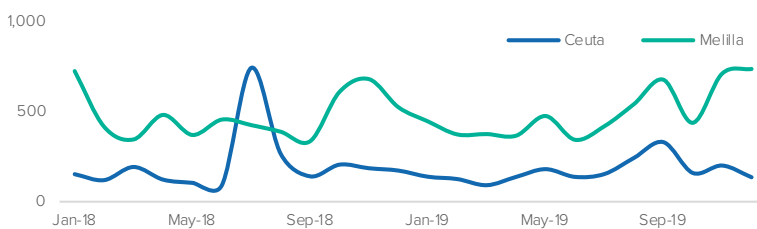

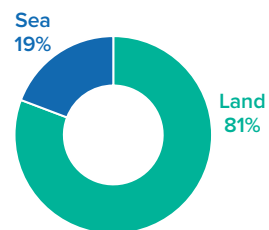

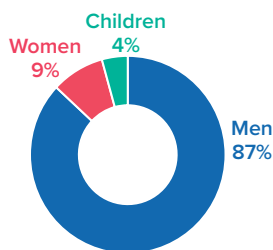

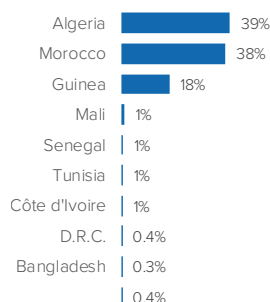


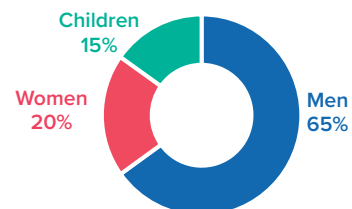

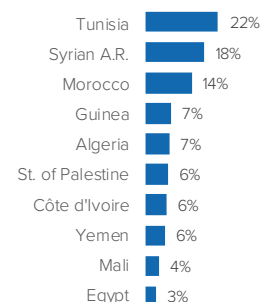
