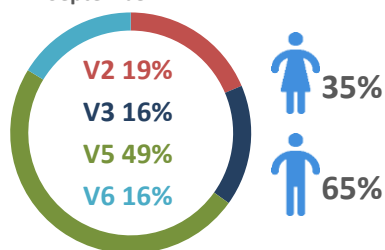

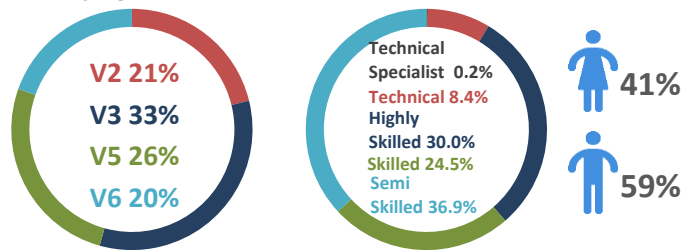

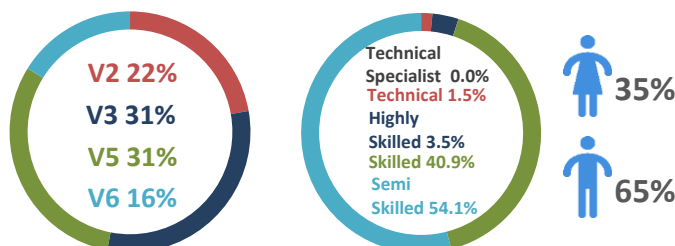
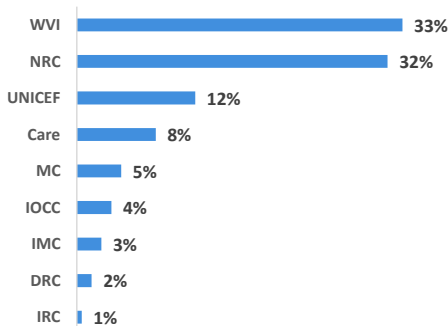

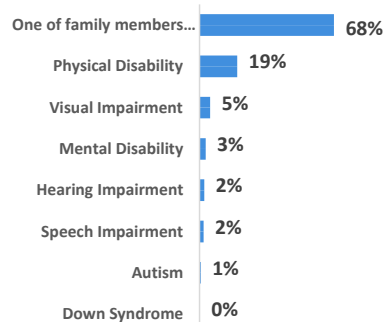

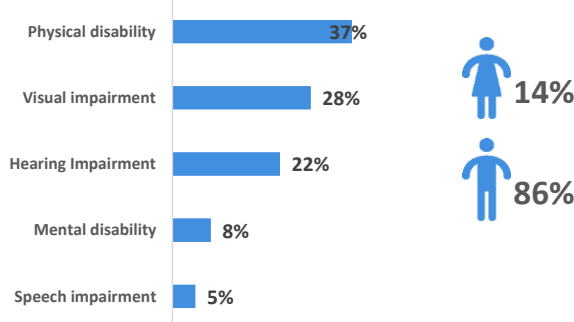

Feedbacks received from the community

- Community representatives suggested to have IBV especial criteria for FHH (widowed and divorced) and give them a priority in the IBV scheme in order to avoid any kind of exploitation as what the CRs mentioned.
- Community members dissatisfied with the lack of job opportunities for elderlies (age 60+) as they mentioned that NGOs prefer to have youth as IBVs to support their daily activities.
