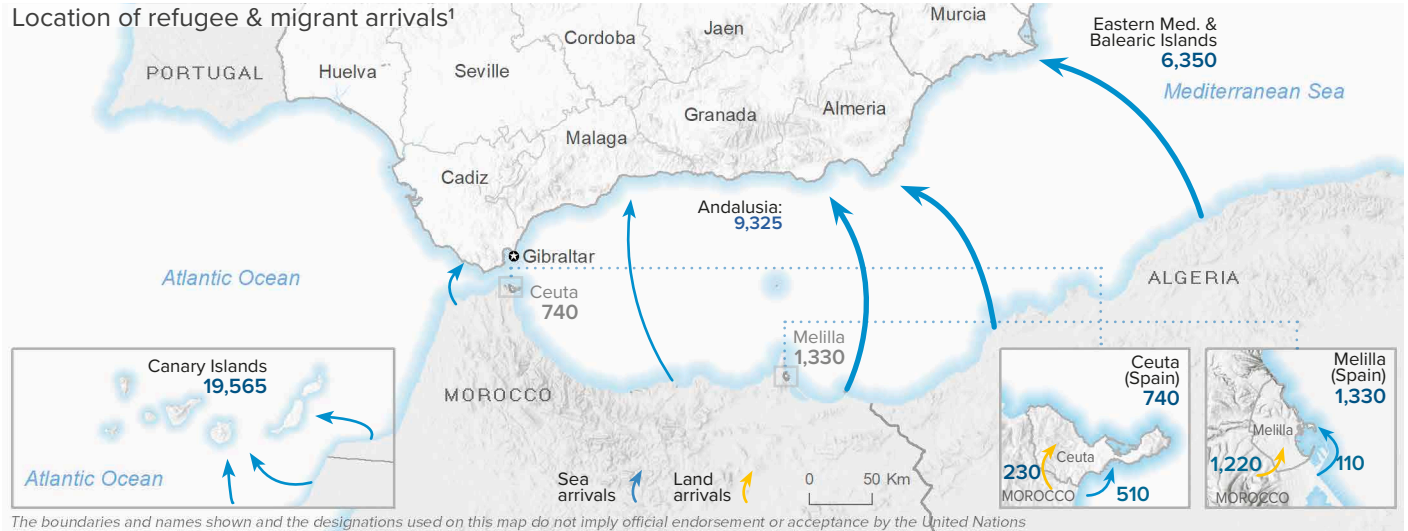

Location of refugee & migrant arrivals<sup>1</sup>

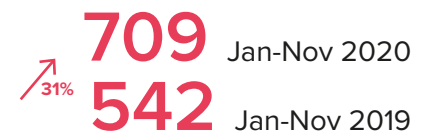
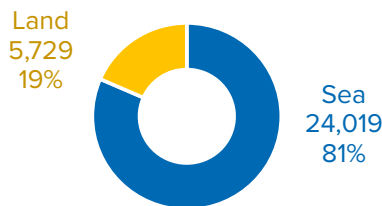
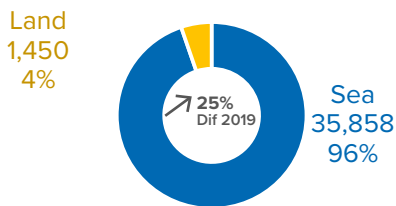

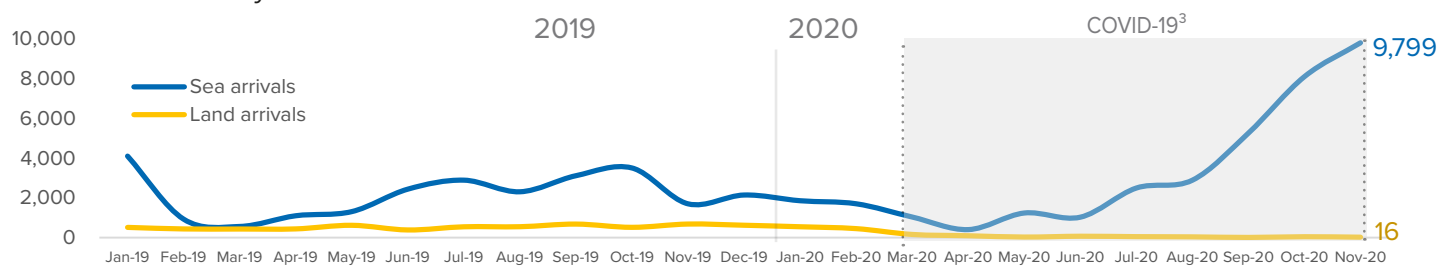

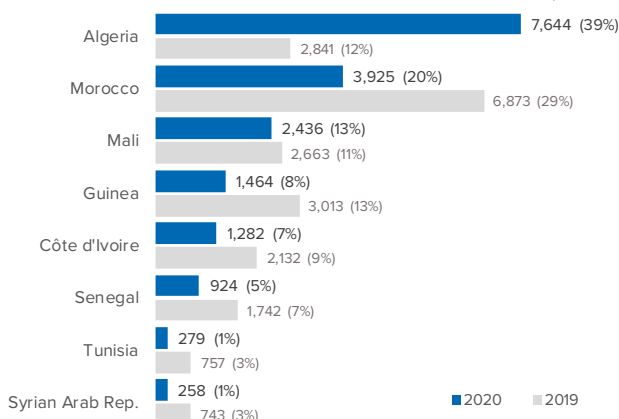

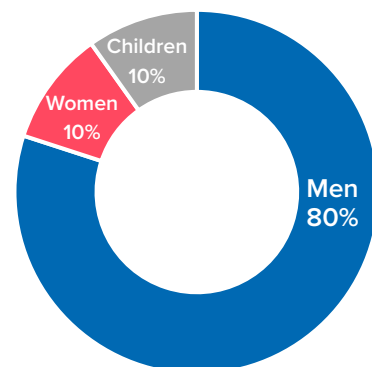
## Arrivals trend by month

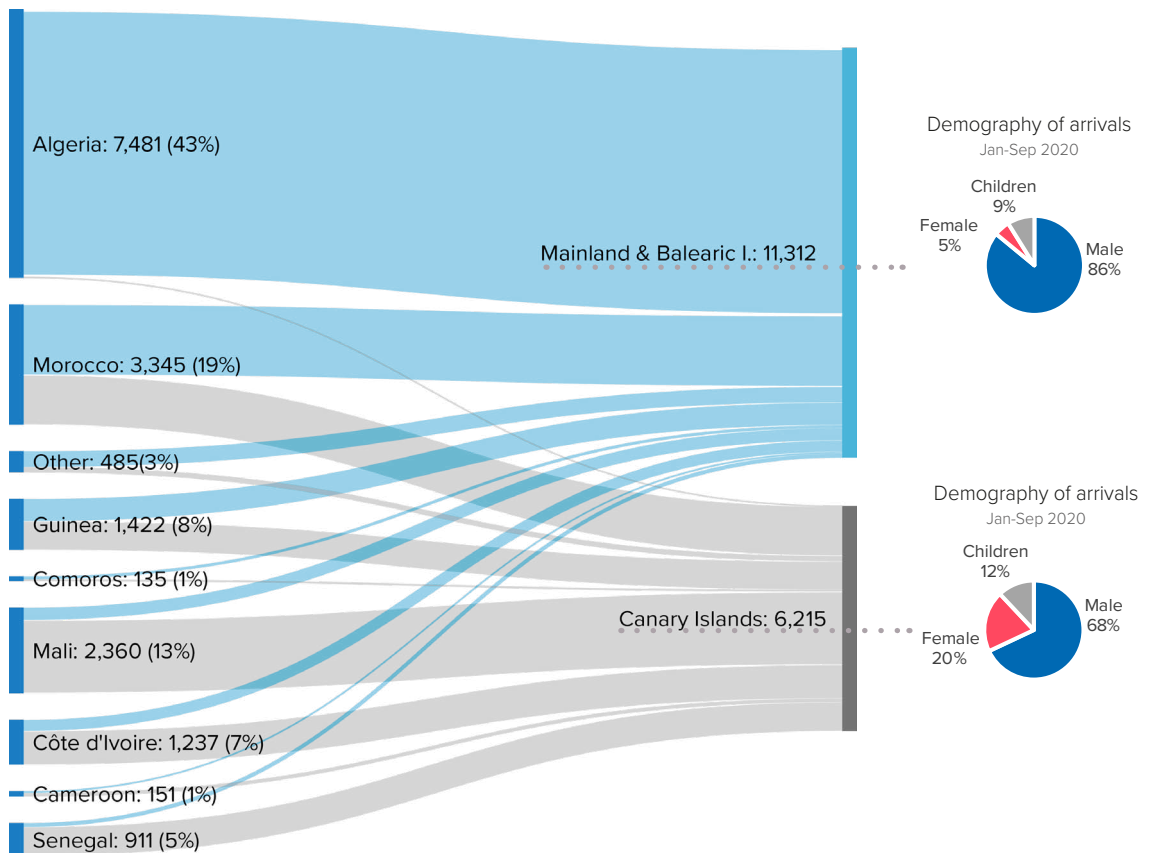

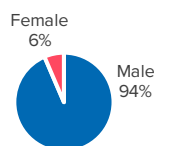

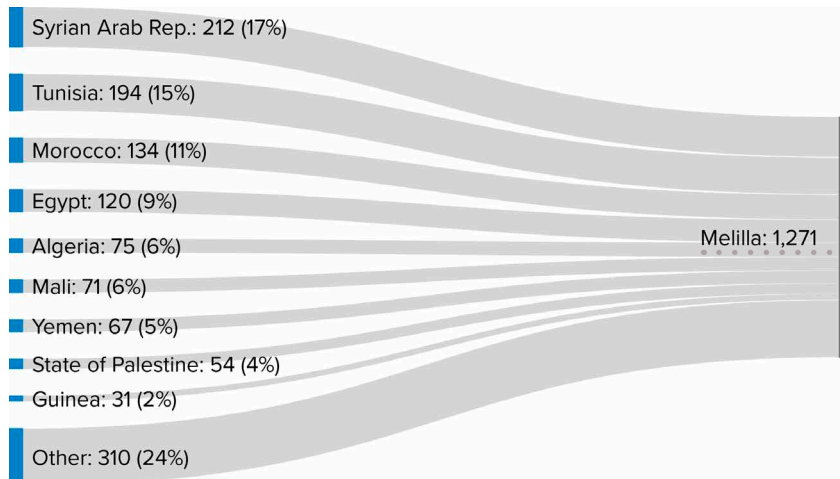
Ceuta: country of origin Jan-Sep 2020



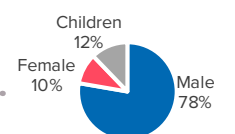
Demography of arrivals Jan-Sep 2020
