CAFOMI:

- Case management continued throughout festive season, not many child protection issues were reported during this period despite the increased number of cases reported in 2020
- Adolescent engagement camp was conducted; concerns were raised on the limited access to sexual and reproductive health information; it was seen necessary to further collaborate with other sectors to ensure enhancement of access to services
- During COVID19 situation, access to sanitary materials was mentioned as a challenge particular in urban areas;
- CPC: Review meeting was conducted to identify challenges and best practices in 2020 and way forward for 2021; need for further engagement with CPCs to address needs in the community;
- Capacity building efforts are undertaken to ensure enhanced coordination at Kampala level with relevant stakeholders and to strengthen the national response

Child Fund:

 Child Fund is working on a 12-months scale up community child protection systems strengthening project for Palorinya. Likely to start implementation in Feb 2021.

• UNHCR Bidibidi:

- o Registration activities are resuming while being alert on COVID19 measures in place
- Working modalities: WV continue to work in shifts;
- Plan International working in zones 1 and 3 for case management; PI has also received some funding to implement a cash program for caregivers
- o SCI is also covering 3 zones providing CM services for children

• LWF in Palorinya:

 New project of LWF financed through the EU Trust Fund which supports the limited resources in Moyo; the project aims at supporting community-based child protection, MHM and peace in schools as well as access to justice. currently rolling out capacity enhancement sessions to ensure that same standards are applied.
