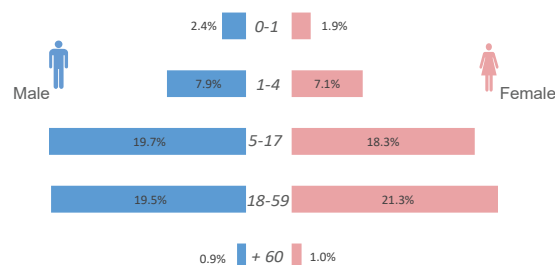

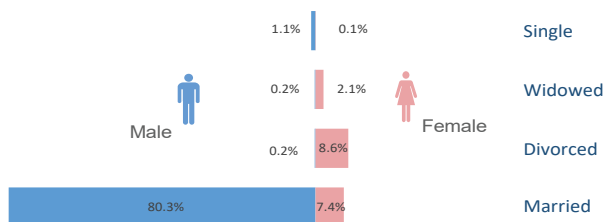
Breakdown of Assessed Households



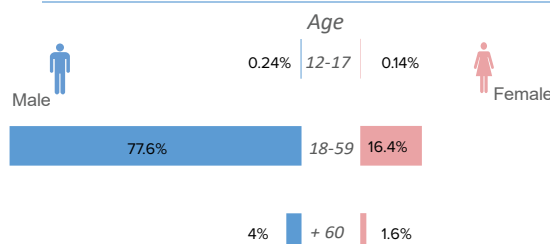
Age and Gender Breakdown of Families



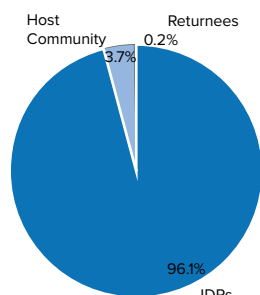
Marital Status of the Interviewed



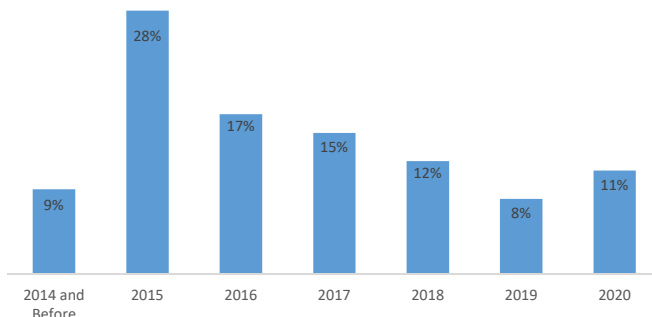

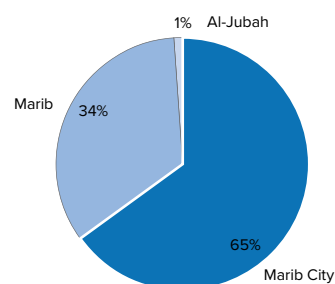

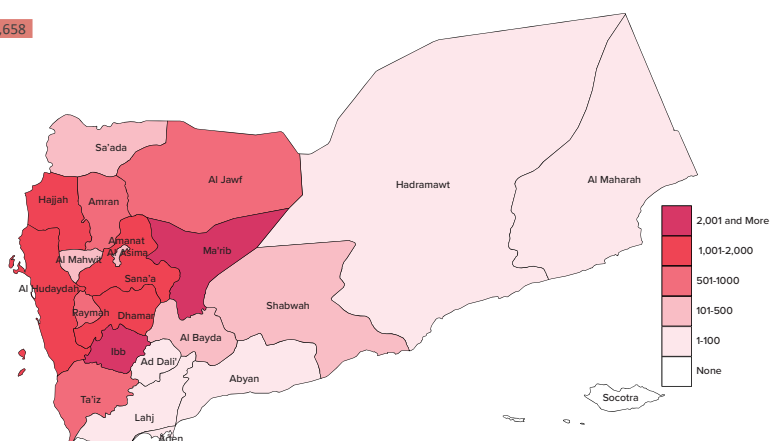
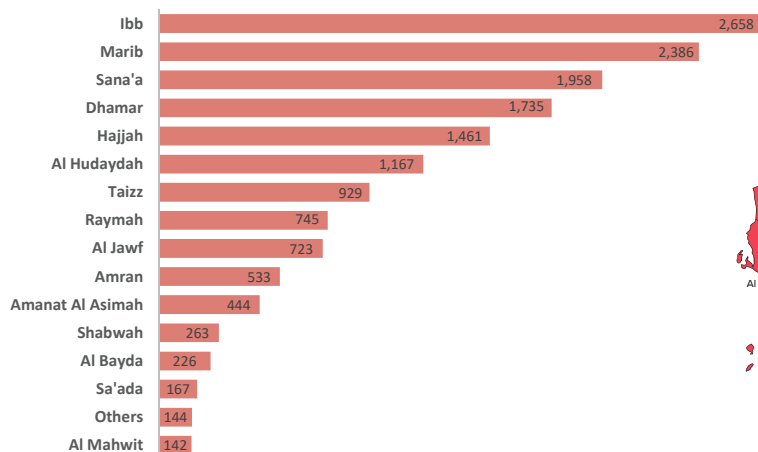
Displacement by Year (IDPs only)

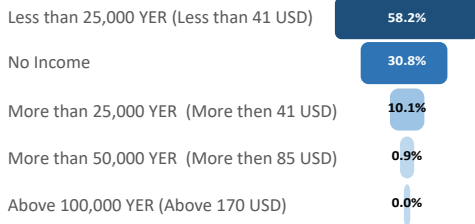


Displacement in Marib by Governorate of Origin

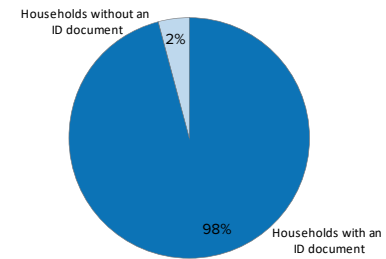




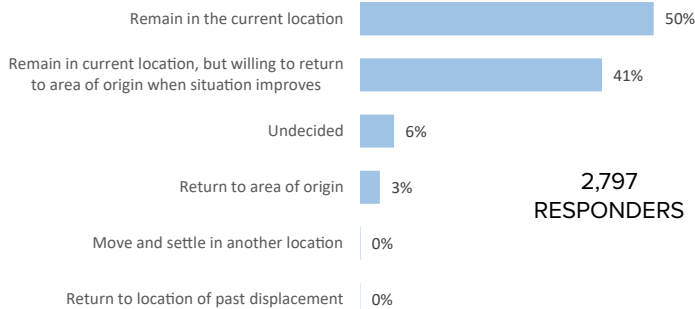
Average Monthly Income by Household



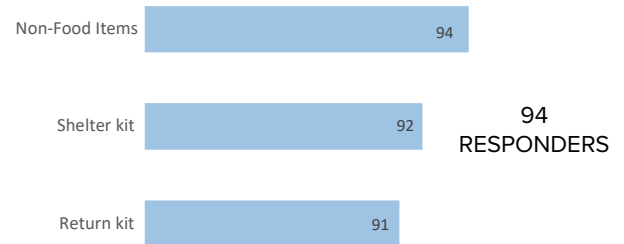
Households with at least one form of ID Document



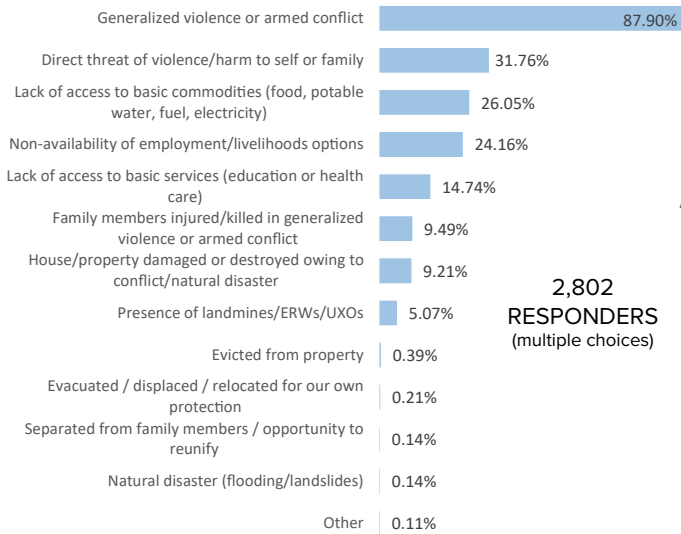
Households Intentions for the next 6 Months (IDPs and Returnees Only)



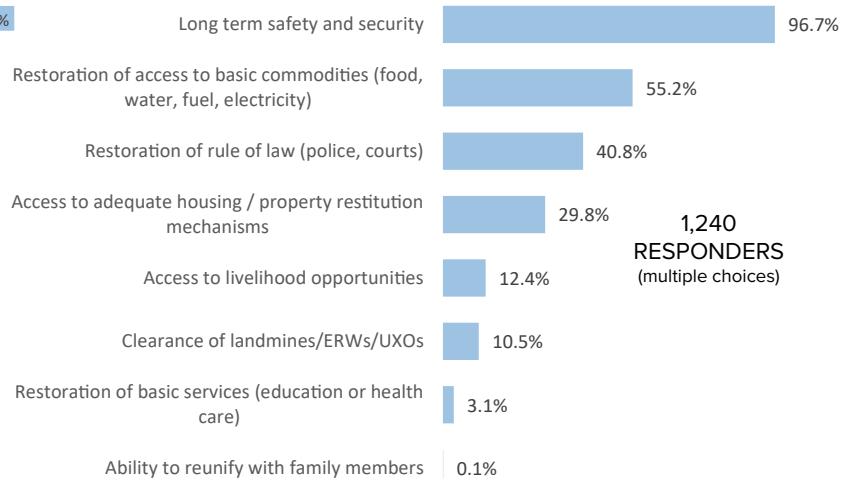
Type of Assistance Needed (If willing to Return for IDPs)



Main reasons for displacement (IDPs and Returnees)

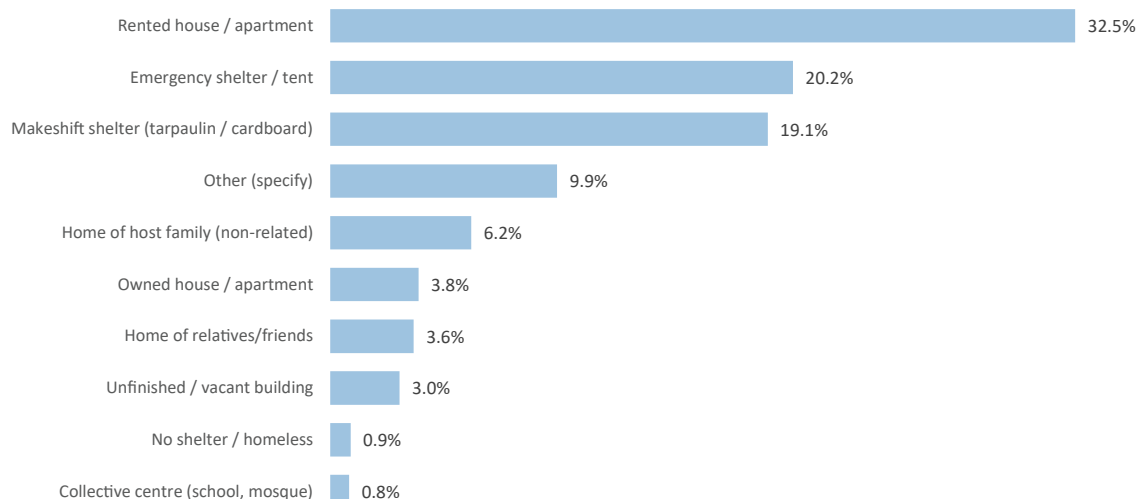

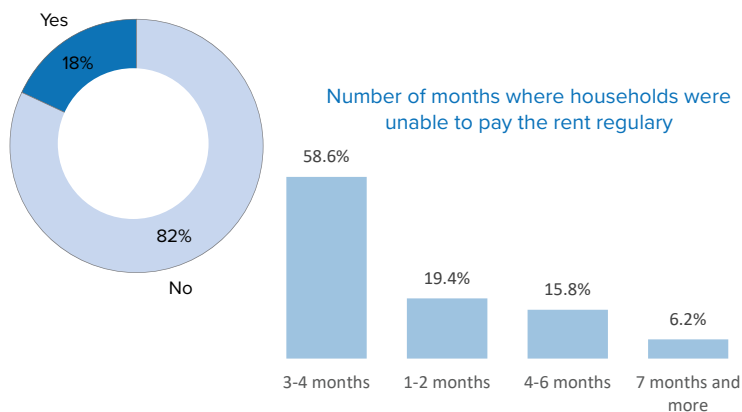

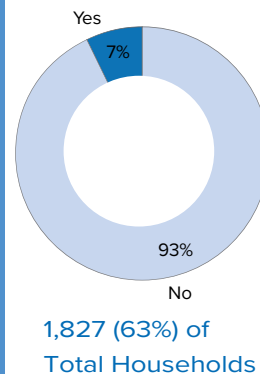
Households Living in Rented House or Apartment

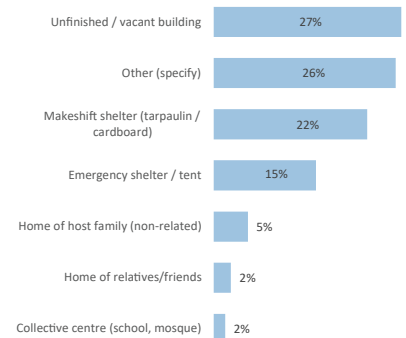

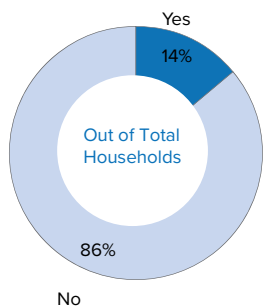

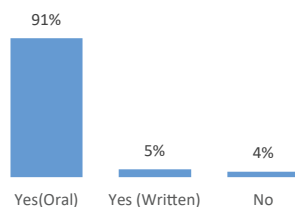


Households threatened with eviction from their current shelter in the last 6 months

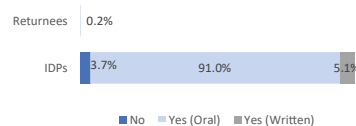

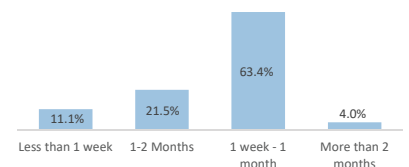
Eviction notice by type



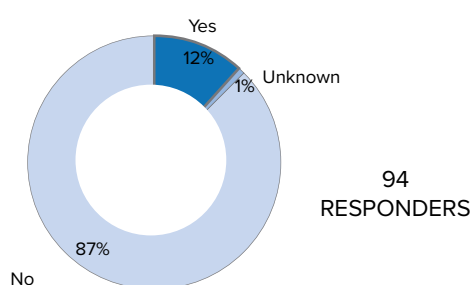
Eviction notice by Households



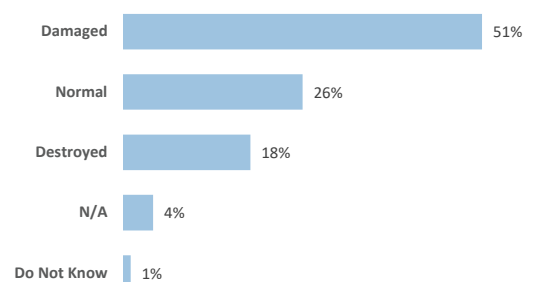
Average eviction notice period

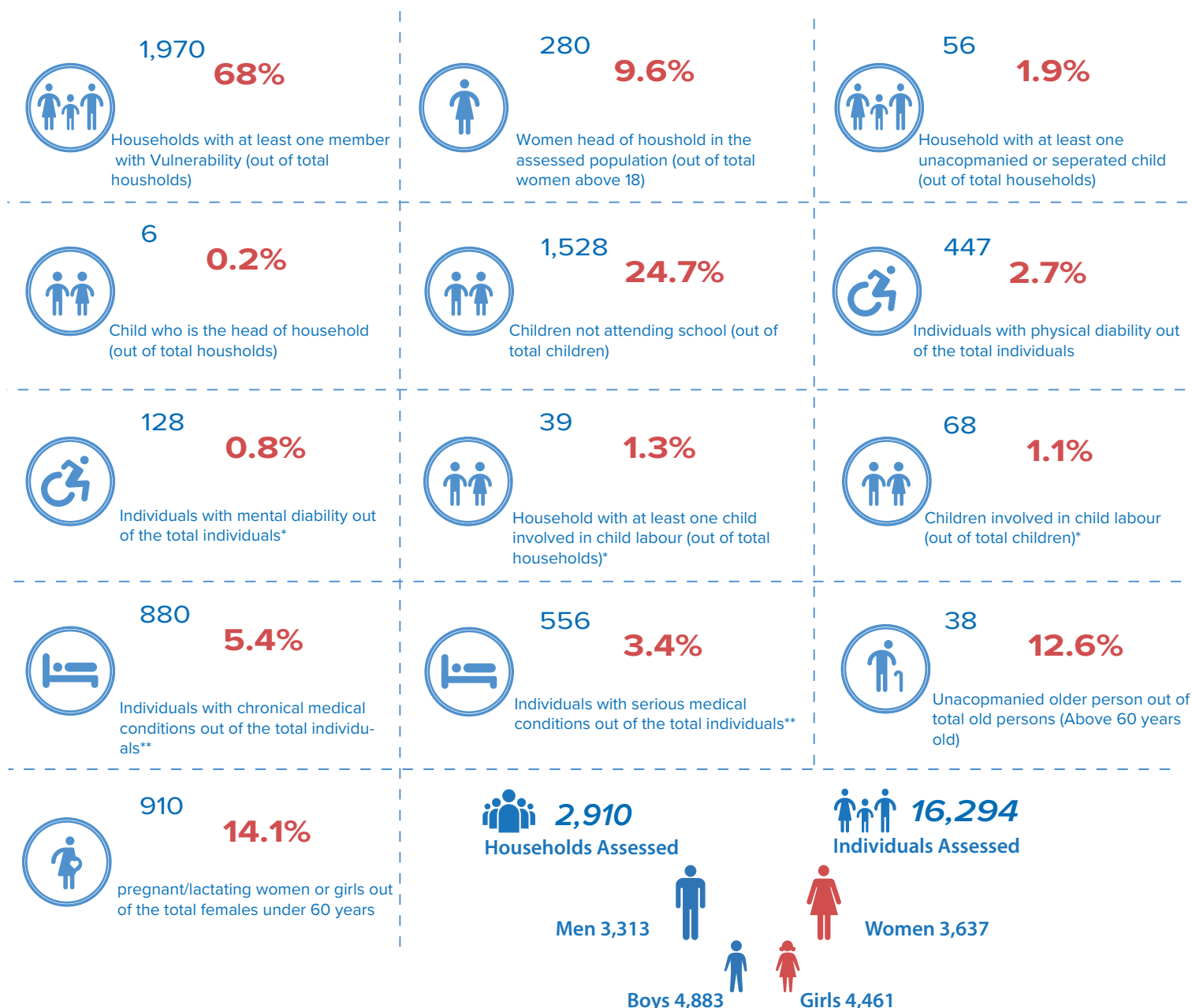

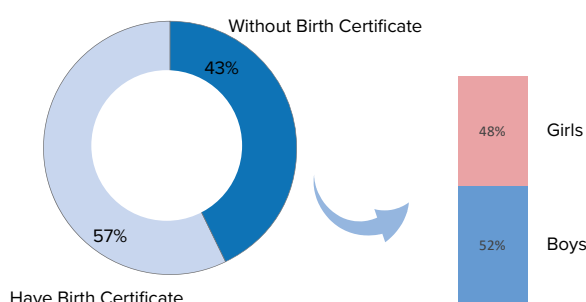

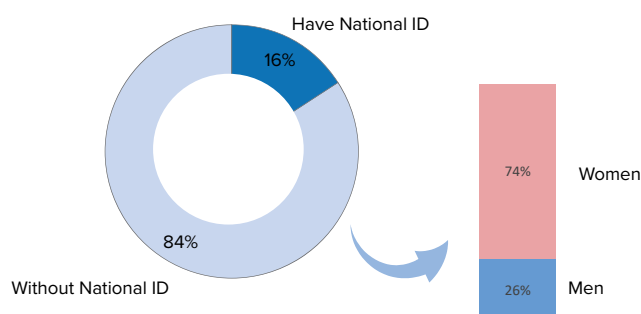


Civil Registration and Documentation

Households with at least one children without birth certificate out of total children

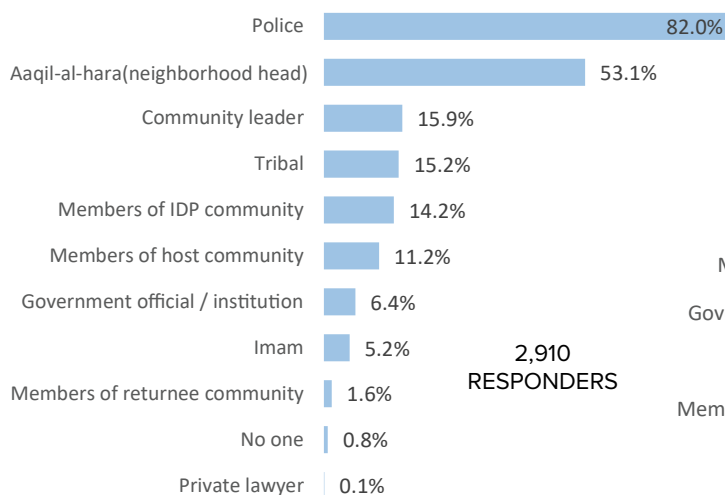


Adult without national ID out of total adults

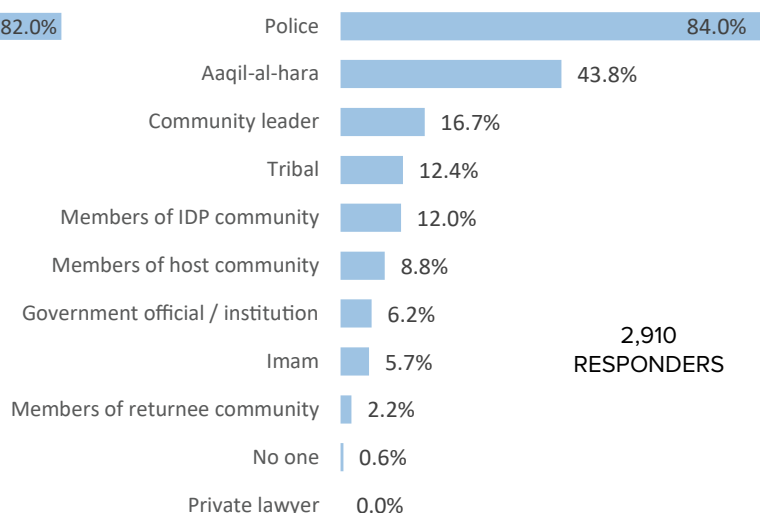

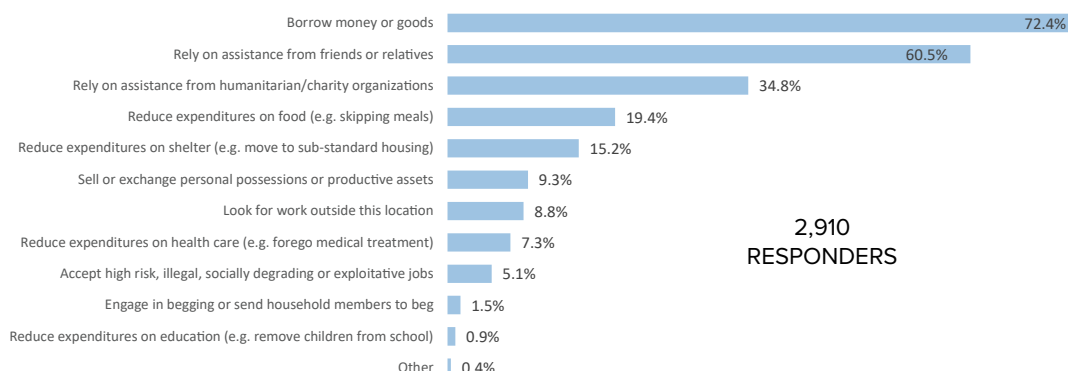
Types of community protection usually sought by households



Types of community protection sought for resolving disputes



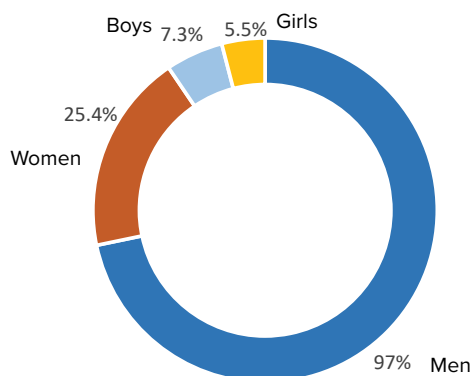
Coping mechanism used by Households to meet basic needs



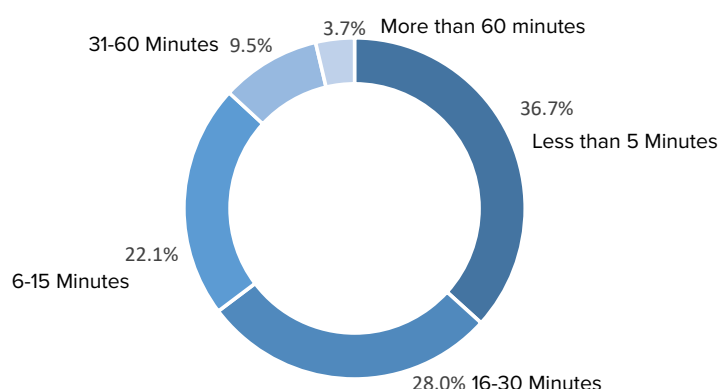

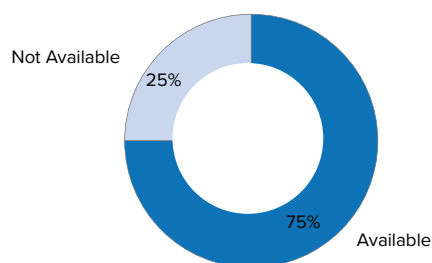
Who is Responsible of Collecting Water/Firewood



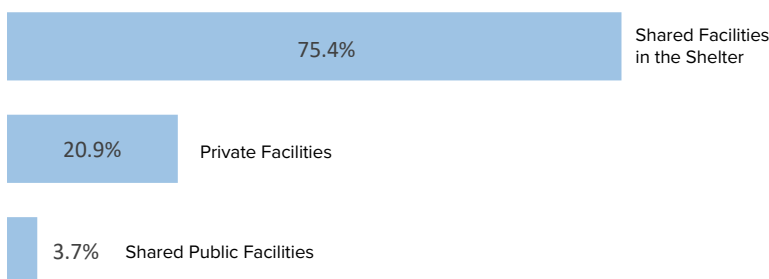
Average Time Needed to Collect Water



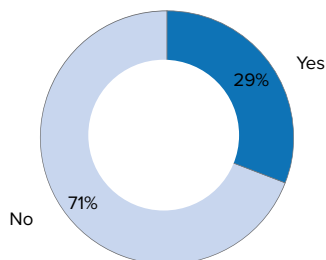
Sanitation Facilities Near the Shelter



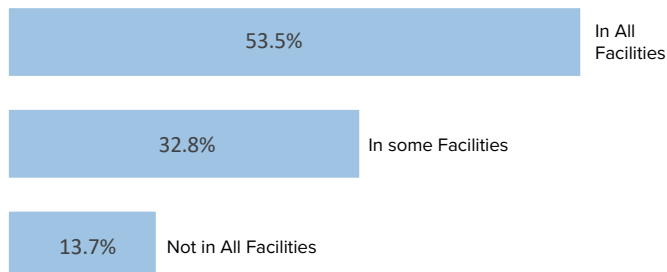
Types of Sanitation Facilities Near the Shelter

Sanitation Facilities Can be locked from the Inside

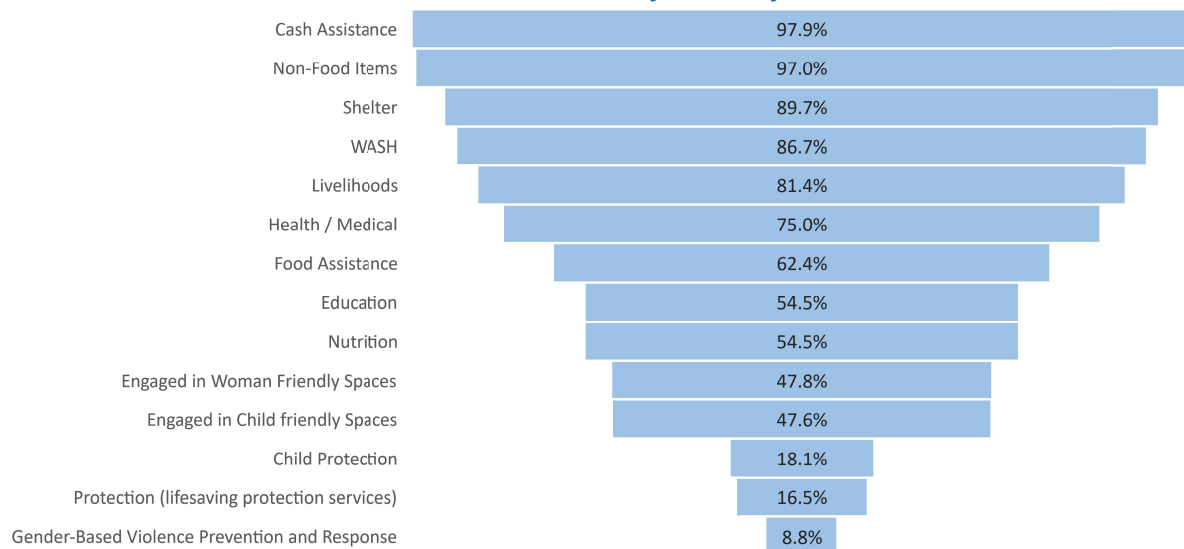

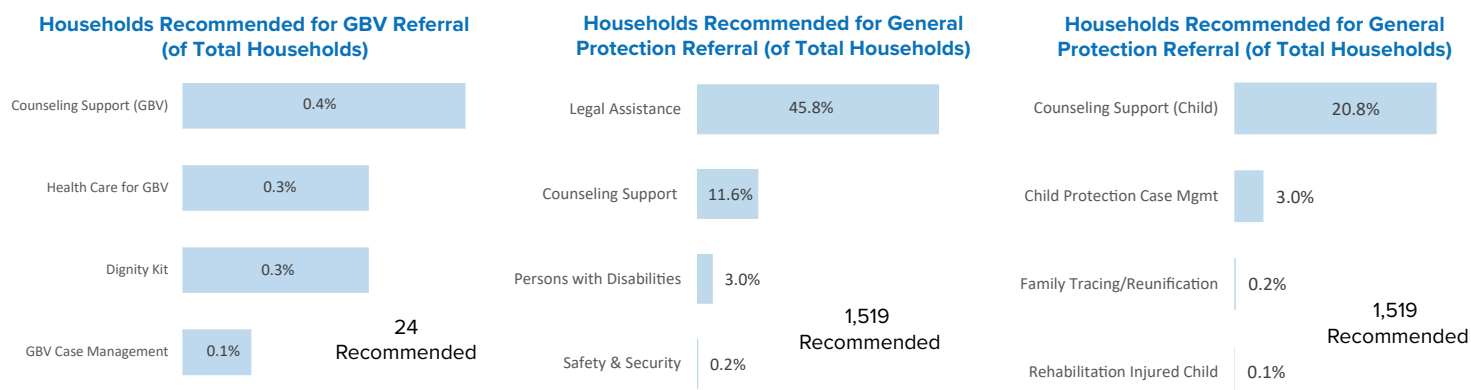

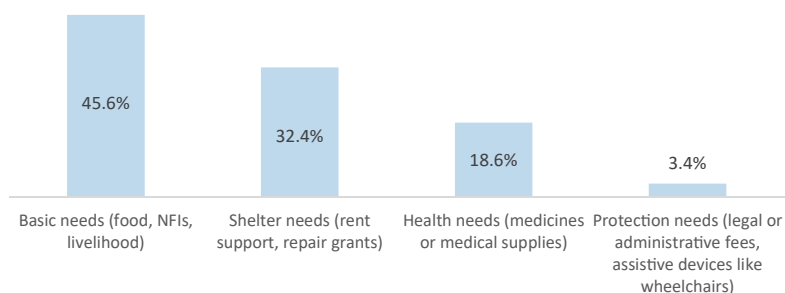
