#### COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION


The camp is divided into 10 quartiers and each quartier consists of approximately 5 villages giving a total of 52 villages. The overall refugee leadership in the camp is vested with the Refugee Executive Committee. These are 8 members who are elected by the community with support from MINEMA, UNHCR and Partners at field level.

## BACKGROUND

Kiziba is the oldest camp in Rwanda and host the largest population of protracted refugees in Rwanda, in Rwankuba Sector, Karongi District, Western Province

Established in 1996 after an influx of refugees from DRC at the start of civil war in DR Congo, Kiziba camp is located about 15 km outside Karongi town.

Of the three traditional durable solutions, resettlement remains the most viable for the majority of refugees in Kiziba Refugee
