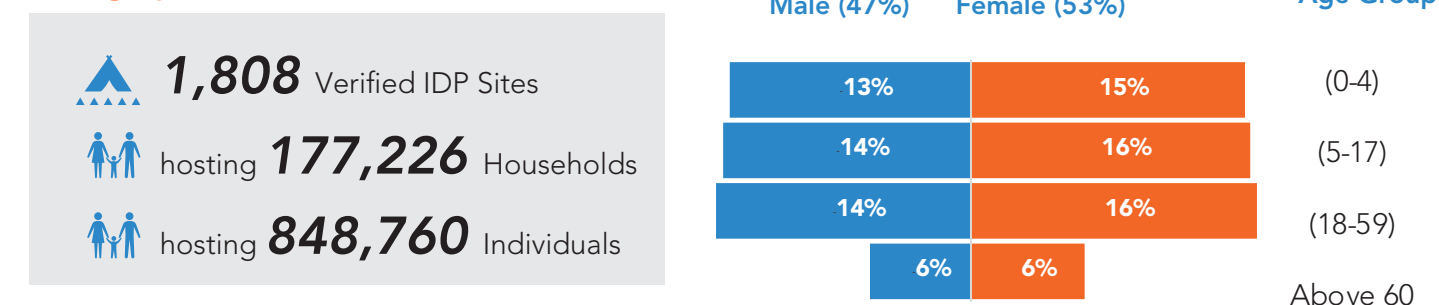


Map of verified IDP sites in Mogadishu Dayniile and Mogadishu Khada - July 2021

Assessment overview

A joint IDP site verification exercise was conducted in Mogadishu Dayniile and Mogadishu Khada in July 2021. The operation was led by Banadir Regional Authority (BRA), AVORD, NoFYL, SCC, SSWC and with support from UNHCR. 1,808 IDP sites were identified hosting 177,226 households or 848,760 individuals. This is the first IDP site verification conducted covering the whole of Mogadishu Khada and Mogadishu Dayniile districts.

Using the Washington group disability questions, statistics of people living with disabilities were derived

Washington Group of Questions (of the 2.5% living with disability:)

- 24% (49% Female)** have difficulty with seeing (even wearing glasses)
- 17% (50% Female)** have difficulty with hearing (even using a hearing aid)
- 14% (48% Female)** have difficulty with communicating and/or understanding
- 21% (48% Female)** have difficulty with walking and/or climbing stairs
- 12% (49% Female)** have difficulty with dressing and/or washing
- 12% (50% Female)** have difficulty with remembering/concentrating

Eviction Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of eviction. Several factors were put into consideration such as IDP site tenure, type of agreements in place and whether an eviction notice has been issued recently.

49% of IDP sites have been classified as having extreme (29%) and high (20%) risk of eviction

- 34%** of sites residents pay rent in form of cash. **32%** are landowner authorized occupancy
- 86%** of sites have agreement in place
- 80%** of those that have agreements have written agreements
- 75%** of those that have agreements have agreed end dates
- 29%** of sites have been issued with eviction notice within the last 3 months

Flood Risk Mapping

IDP sites were assessed based on their risk of flooding.

233 IDP sites (26%) have been classified as extreme (always floods) and high (floods frequently)
