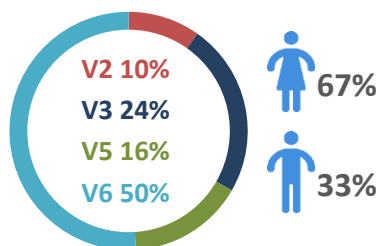

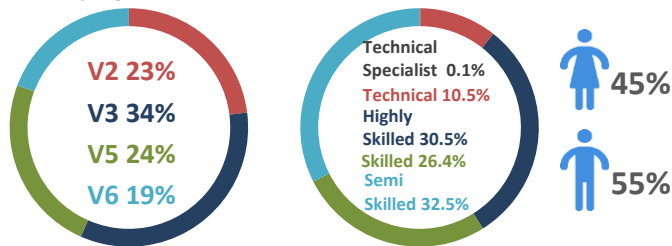

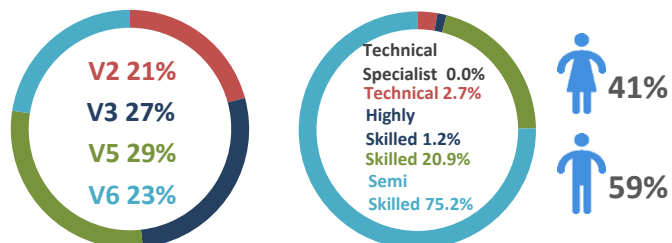
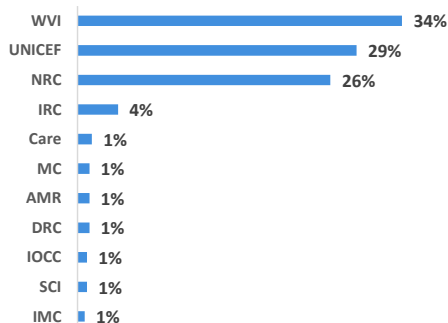

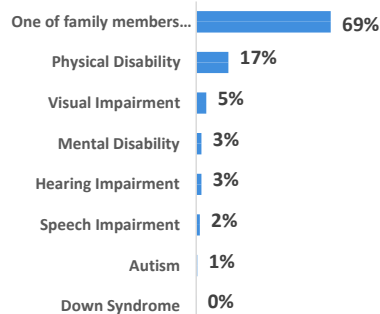

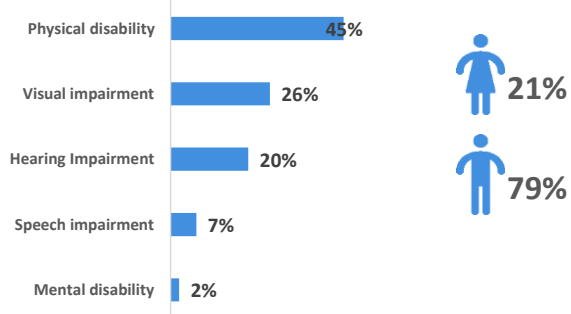

Feedback received from the community:

- Community members were dissatisfied with some cases where two family members working as some volunteers are not being reported by hiring agencies to be engaged in IBV scheme.
- Community members were dissatisfied with long contracts and the exceptional cases, and they provided some feedback about difficult financial situation and long work contracts which make the situation more complicated.
- Elderlies and people with disability asked to increase IBVs opportunities for them.
