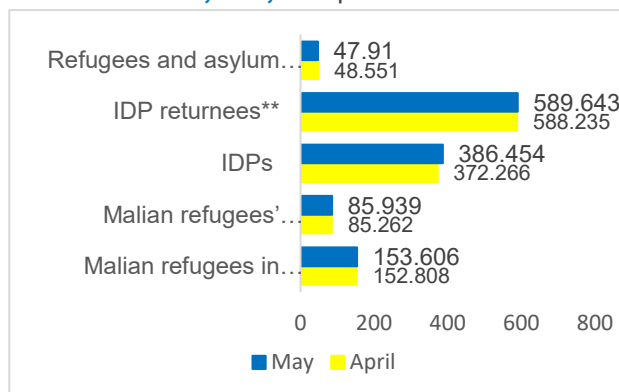

#### POPULATION OF CONCERN

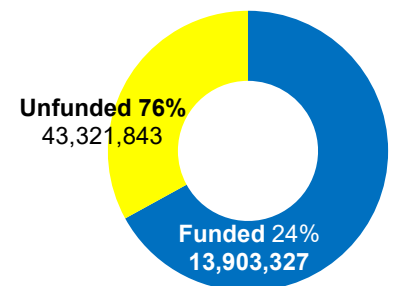

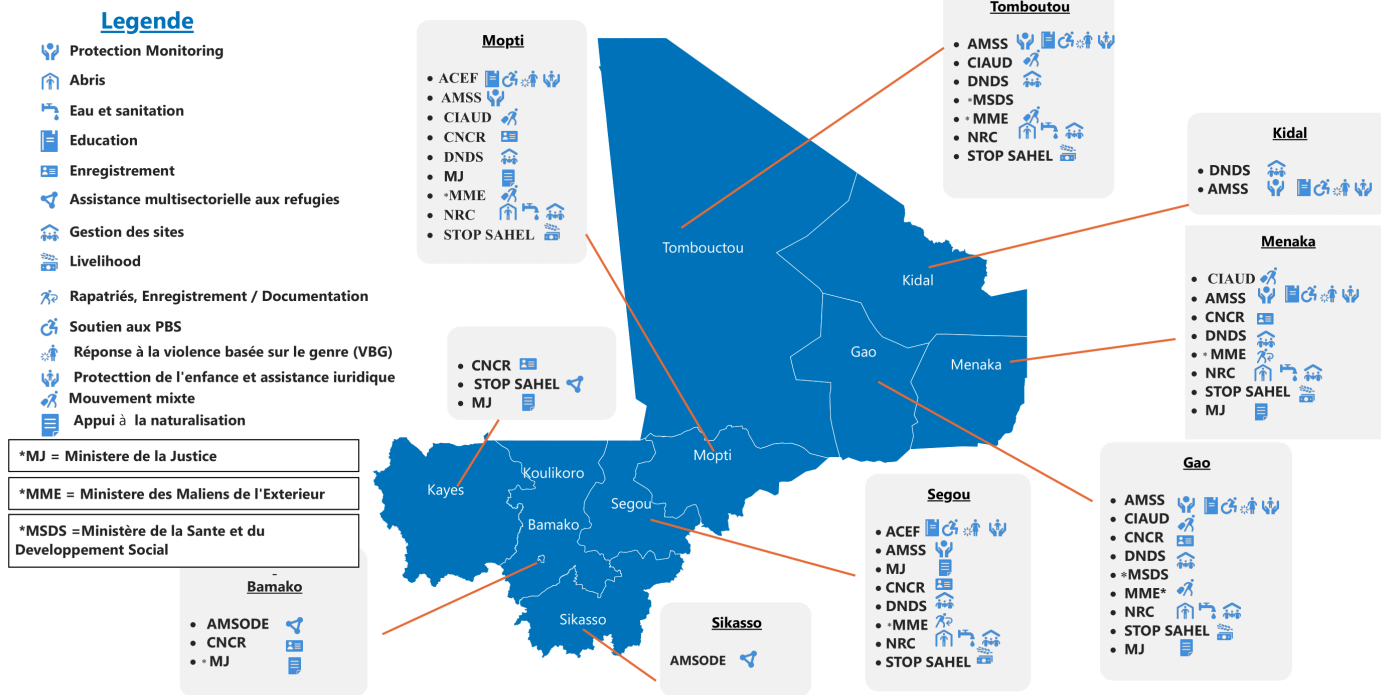

## MAIN ACTIVITIES

### PROTECTION CLUSTER

- In May 2021, 560 protection incidents were recorded by the protection monitoring system, including 455 incidents against men, 76 against women, ten against boys, and 19 against girls. The region of Mopti remains the most affected by these incidents (39%) followed by Gao (24%). As a reminder, in April, 635 protection incidents were recorded by the protection monitoring system.
- In May, the *Commission Mouvement de Population* (CMP) published April's report on population movements, which indicated the presence of more than 372,000 internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Mali. In April 2021, 129 displacement sites were assessed. As such, the report notes that in 49% of the sites, IDP children did not attend school during the assessment period, and that women do not feel safe in 16% of the sites.
- UNHCR, through the Protection Cluster, developed and published a Guidance note on protection in emergencies. The note provides guidance to protection partners and donors on the activities and response modalities to prioritize during a protection emergency in Mali, thus ultimately enabling the development of responses that are more suited to the context.

## PROTECTION

### Mixed Movements:

- In May, 1,003 persons on the move were identified in mixed flows in Mali, the majority identified in the regions of Timbuktu and Mopti (311 and 289 persons respectively). Approximately 43% of people reported moving for economic reasons, and 42% reported fleeing insecurity in their country of origin. The remainder moved for other reasons such as family reunification and return to country of origin.
- With its partner CIAUD Canada, UNHCR conducted 25 sensitization sessions on various themes related to mixed movements, international protection and Covid-19 prevention measures. These sessions reached a total of approximately 790 community members and persons on the move.

### Gender-Based Violence (GBV):

- In Mopti, UNHCR and its partners conducted three sensitization sessions on gender-based violence, reaching 60 women and 23 men.
- On 24 May, UNHCR in Mopti, through its partner ACEF, conducted a Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) and Code of conduct capacity-building session for 40 members of the Local Protection Committee (CLPC), including 30 men and ten women.
- In Timbuktu, UNHCR and its partners conducted ten sensitization sessions on gender-based violence, reaching 244 persons, including 142 women, 48 girls, 42 men, and 12 boys.
- In Gao region, 34 survivors of gender-based violence in Ansongo, Gossi, and Menaka, including sexual assault, rape, early marriage, and physical assault cases received psychosocial support.

### Registration and documentation:

### Self-reliance and inclusion:

- In Bamako UNHCR provided 1,650,000 XOF multi-purpose cash assistance for 22 IDPs with specific needs, including 75,000 XOF per person.
- UNHCR conducted sensitization session for 44 Burkinabe refugees on the promising sectors and socioeconomic opportunities in Faragouaran.

### Durable Solutions:

- UNHCR have been planning the voluntary return of 11 Ivorian refugee households, for a total of 50 persons.
- A survey conducted on the intention of voluntary return, with Ivorian refugee households, indicated that 105 households (61% of the total population) said they intend to return to their country of origin. 26% are ready to return promptly while 35% of them said they intend to do so in the future.

## EDUCATION

- In Bamako, UNHCR conducted a sensitization session on the importance of education, reaching 23 parents, including 12 men and 11 women.
- In Timbuktu, UNHCR handed over six classrooms in two schools, 400 school kits, and 200 solar radios, to facilitate access to education for IDP, IDP returnees, and refugee returnee children.
- In Mopti, UNHCR conducted capacity-building sessions on GBV, psychosocial support, and child protection in emergency situations for 25 teachers, including nine women and 16 men.

## HEALTH

- UNHCR supported 728 households in urban areas, including 1,542 beneficiaries, to re-register in a healthcare scheme. 1,051 cards were already withdrawn.
- UNHCR conducted two sensitization sessions, reaching 88 participants, including 46 women and 42 men, on vaccination against COVID-19 and the regular payment of the monthly health insurance contribution.

## WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH)

- From January to May 2021, UNHCR successfully implemented a drilled borehole, equipped with an Improved Rural Hydraulic System (SHVA) of Solar pumping potable water, at a school, in Gao region. The borehole aims, among other objectives, to reduce school dropouts.

## SHELTER AND NON-FOOD-ITEMS (NFIs)

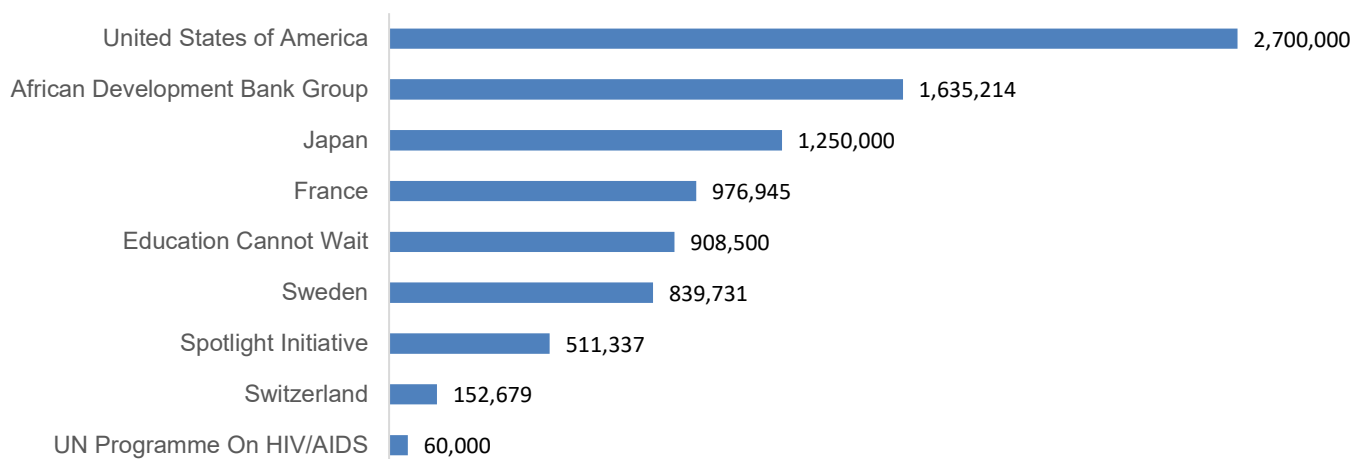
- From January to May 2021, UNHCR, and its partner NRC, provided 1,688 shelters to 1,688 households and distributed Non-Food-Item (NFI) kits for 1,532 persons of concern, as follows:
  - 70 IDPs' households have been dwelled in emergency shelters in Sokolo and Dougouba, region of Segou.
  - 1,301 IDP households had been provided with NFIs kits, in Mopti.
  - Furthermore 1,081 emergency shelters were provided to 1,075 IDP households, in Mopti region, and six (Refugee Housing Unit) had been handed over for the Implementation of six centers, to bring psychosocial care to Gender Based Violence (GBV) survivors, identified within IDP settlements.
  - Distribution of 1,075 NFI kits to households, including for 281 households in May.
  - 170 Malian returnee, 86 Refugee and 281 IDP households, of respectively 755, 499 and 1,450 people were provided with 537 emergency shelters (Family Tents). Additionally, 231 households of 1,287 people, including 499 Refugees and 788 IDPs, received NFI kits, in Gao region.
- NFI kits, distributed in May, include cooking sets, mosquito nets, jerricans, plastic buckets, mattresses, blankets, and solar lights in Gao, Mopti, and Segou.

## Financial Information

UNHCR is grateful for the critical support provided by donors who have contributed to this operation as well as those who have contributed to UNHCR programs with unearmarked and broadly earmarked funds.

Total recorded contributions for the operation amount to some **US\$ 13,903,327** million.
