



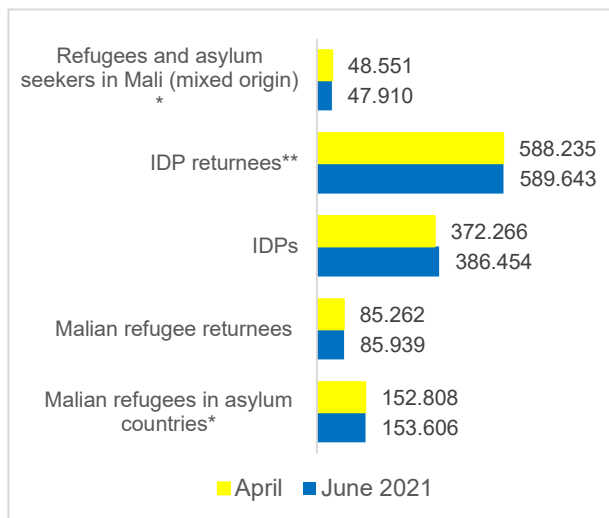

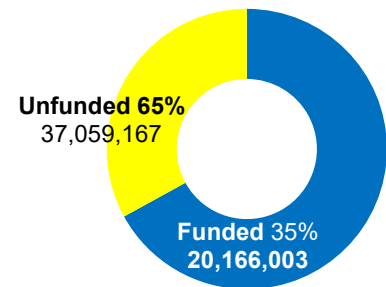
**POPULATION OF CONCERN

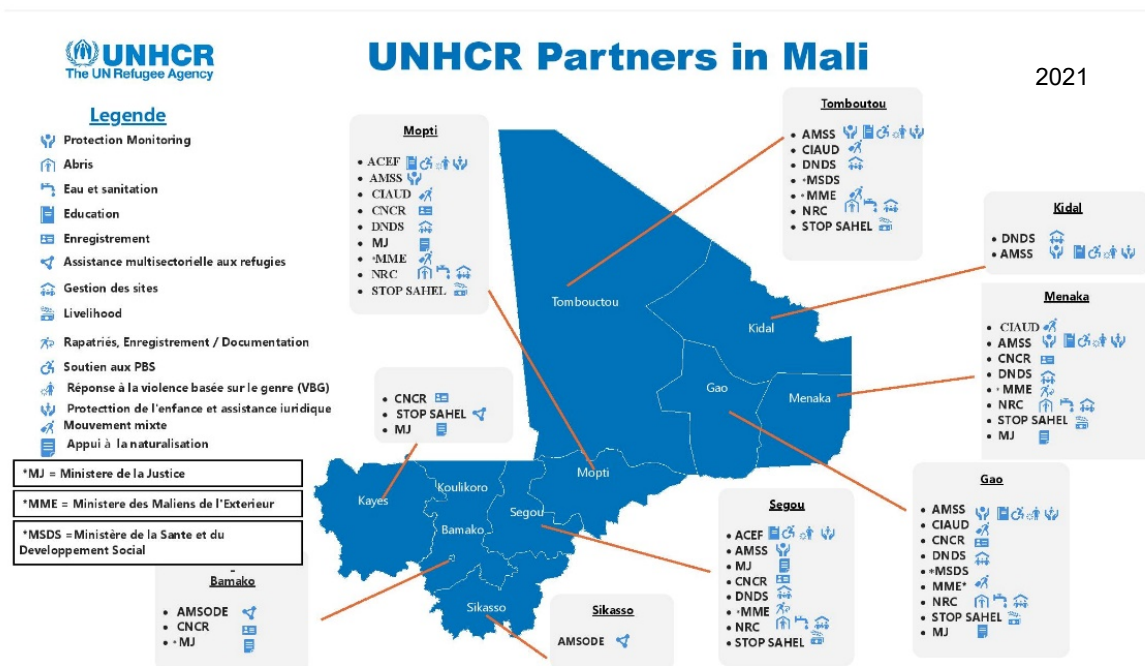

MAIN ACTIVITIES

PROTECTION CLUSTER

- In June 2021, the Protection Monitoring System recorded 1,237 protection incidents, which represents a drastic increase, reaching the highest level since the introduction of the protection monitoring system in Mali. This increase is attributed to the recording of forced population movements following multiple village attacks in the Mopti region. As a reminder, the Protection Monitoring system recorded 560 incidents in May.
- In June, the *Commission Mouvement de Populations* (CMP) issued its report, which includes information on internally displaced persons (IDPs), IDP returnees, and refugee returnees. According to these data, the number of IDPs has risen from 372,266 in April 2021, to 386,454 as of 31 May, a 14,188 increase. The majority of IDPs live in Mopti, Gao, Timbuktu, Segou, and Menaka.

PROTECTION

Mixed Movements:

- In June, 1,116 persons on the move were identified in mixed flows in Mali, 12% more than in May. The majority of people were identified in the regions of Timbuktu and Mopti (377 and 311 persons respectively). Approximately 20% of these refugees and migrants reported being the victims of abuse or violence during their journey, including extortion and illegal taxes, physical violence, threats, and detention.
- With its partner CIAUD Canada, UNHCR conducted sensitization activities and strengthened its partnerships with key actors by providing equipment to gendarmerie and border posts in Léré (Timbuktu region) and Labbezanga (Gao region), supporting the Direy Ben Association in Gao, and donating masks, handwashing equipment, soap, and hand sanitizer to the *Direction Régionale de la Protection Civile* in Timbuktu.
- In June, UNHCR and its partners conducted sensitization sessions on various themes related to mixed movements, international protection and COVID-19 prevention measures, in Gao (four sessions, reaching 61 women and 47 men), Mopti (16 sessions, reaching 253 men, 61 women, and 19 children), Timbuktu (five sessions, reaching 273 men and 39 women), and Kayes (five sessions, reaching 49 men).

Reception and Orientation:

- In June, UNHCR received and oriented three refugees and one other of concern, all men. Their requests focused on documentation, health, assistance following an incident, and asylum, resettlement, and Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) needs. They were provided with the necessary information and guidance.

Registration and Documentation:

- As of 30 June, eight new requests for Convention Travel Document (CTD) were received and processed. Five people received their CTD which enabled them to travel in the sub-region to pursue their studies, professional activities and for health care.

Durable Solutions:

- In June, UNHCR and its partners conducted two sensitization sessions on voluntary repatriation for Ivorian refugees in Bamako.
- UNHCR and its partners started the preparations of the convoy, for the voluntary repatriation of Ivorian refugees, including 80 people by the Bamako-Sikasso-Pogo and Korhogo road, southern Mali.
- In June, UNHCR initiated the preparations of the tenth Tripartite meeting (Mali – UNHCR - Burkina Faso), scheduled for 11 and 12 August.

EDUCATION

- UNHCR conducted a training session in Ansongo, Gao region, for 55 teachers, including 20 women and 35 men, on Education and child protection in emergency situations, Education on peace, and Psychosocial support.

SHELTER & NON-FOOD-ITEMS (NFIs)

- In the areas of Segou, Mopti, and Gao, UNHCR provided 1,593 families with Non-Food Items (NFIs) kits, which included cooking sets, mosquito nets, jerricans, plastic buckets, sleeping beds, blankets, and solar lamps. Over the same period, UNHCR provided 1,688 shelters to 1,688 families.
- In Segou region, UNHCR provided emergency shelter to 70 IDP households, as of June.
- In Mopti, from January to June 2021, 1,362 IDP families in Mopti received NFIs kits. In addition, 1,081 emergency shelters were provided to 1,075 IDP households in the Mopti region, and six Refugee Housing Units were handed over for the installation of six centers providing psychosocial support to GBV survivors, located within IDP settlements. During the same period, NFI kits were distributed to 1,075 families.
- In Gao, from January to June 2021, 170 refugee returnees, 86 refugees, and 281 IDP households, totaling 2,704 people, were housed in 537 emergency shelters (Family Tents). Furthermore, UNHCR assisted 231 families, including 1,287 people (499 Refugees and 788 IDPs). The assistance was part of the protection goals to set quick relief, lifesaving, and recovery to populations victims of conflicts and violence.

WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH)

- From January to June 2021, UNHCR implemented three successful drilled boreholes. One was equipped with an Improved Rural Hydraulic System (SHVA) of Solar pumping potable water, in Gao region, and two others were equipped with human powered pumps in Tenenkou circle, Mopti region.

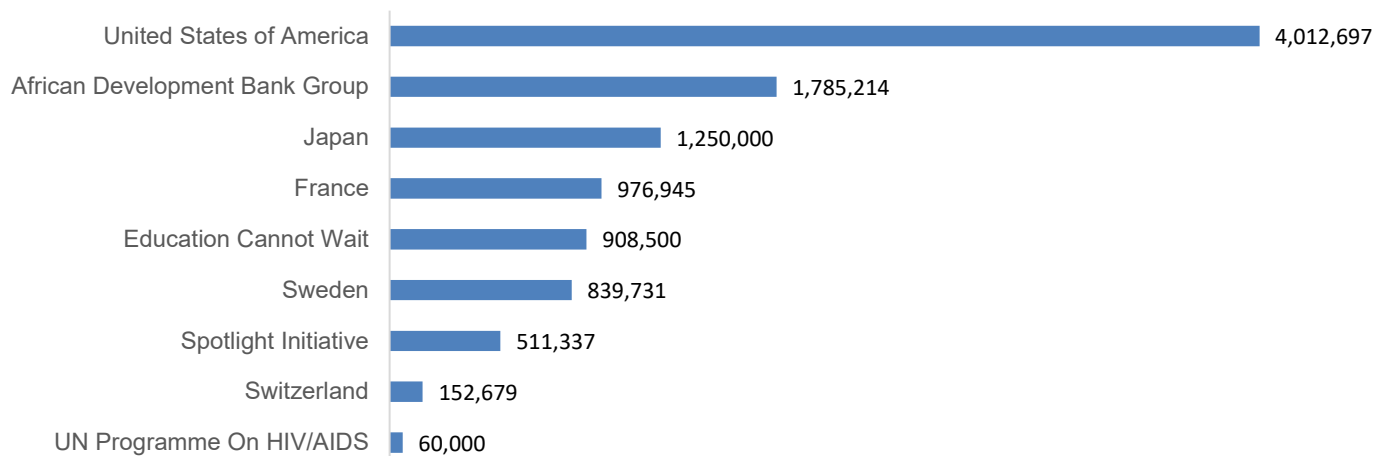
The implemented water infrastructures will play an important role in providing safe and quality drinking water to families with limited access to social services, as well as reducing pressure on existing facilities, which were indirectly attributed as a source of tension between communities in areas of displacement.

Financial Information

UNHCR is grateful for the critical support provided by donors who have contributed to this operation as well as those who have contributed to UNHCR programs with unearmarked and broadly earmarked funds.
