

### Highlights

1. The DRC<sup>1</sup> is the country with the largest internally displaced population in Africa
2. DRC hosts over 0.5 M<sup>2</sup> refugees and asylum seekers
3. Lack of a proper civil registration system puts many at risk of statelessness in DRC. UNHCR<sup>3</sup> joins the United Nations Legal Identity Program to help the DRC government put in place a strong registration system that is inclusive for all types of populations, ensuring that no one is left behind.

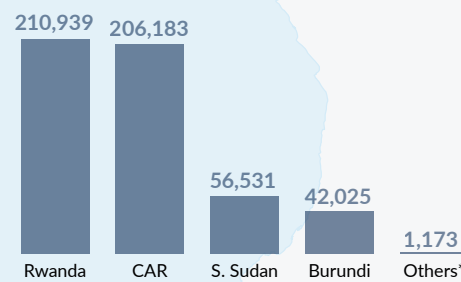

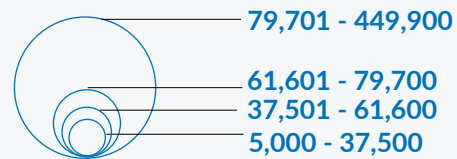

Number of Refugees and Asylum Seekers by Country of Origin

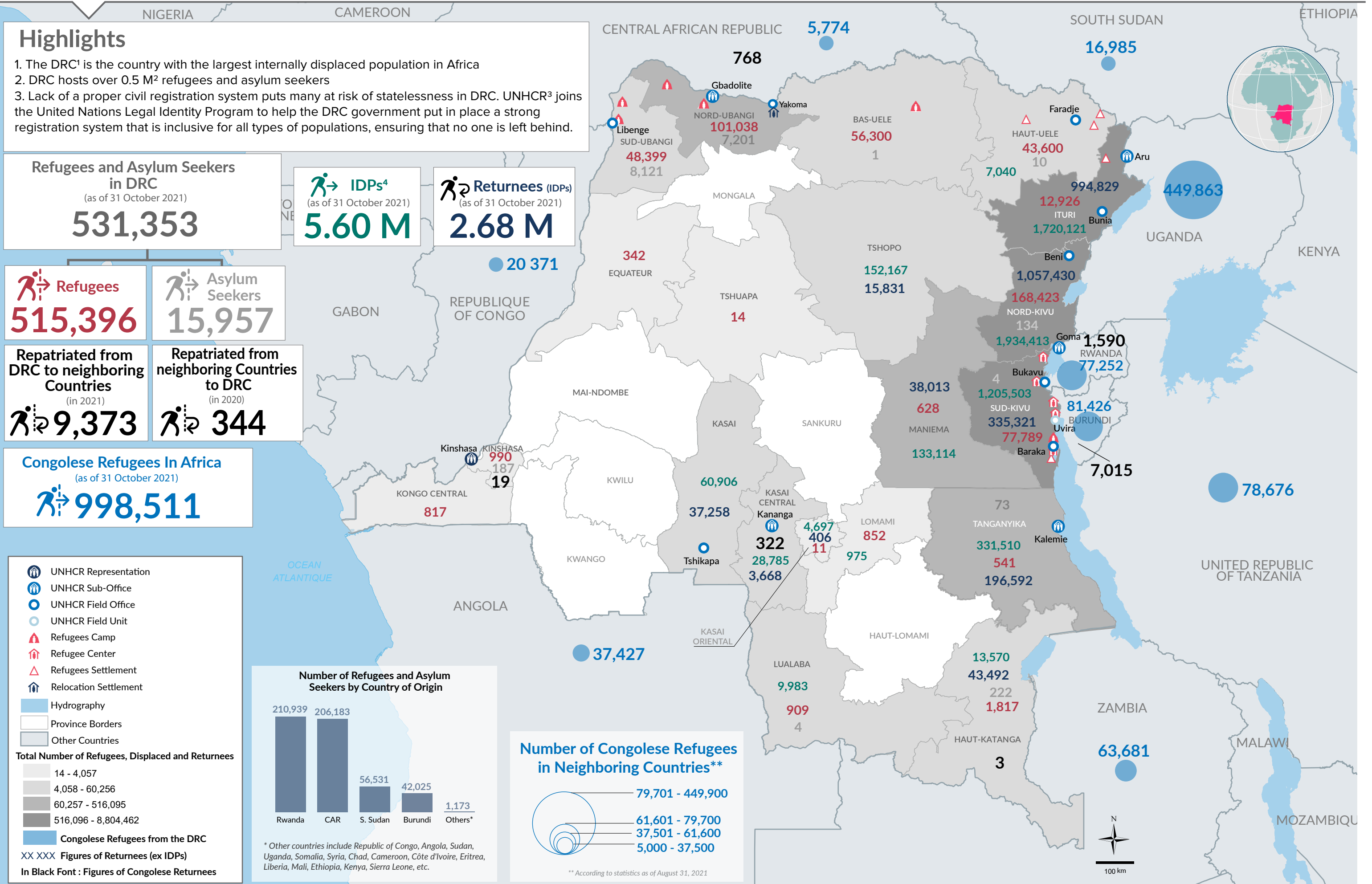
