Introduction

Al Abr District is one of Hadramaut Governorate districts. It is located in the east of Hadramout. It has a population of about 6000. Currently, the district hosts thousands of IDPs. There are (3401) households with (19659) individuals. Over the period Oct. and Nov. 2021, the district received hundreds of displaced households that come from different governorates. (211) with (1899) individuals arrived the district over Oct. and Nov. 2021. They arrived from Marib, Shabowah and Albayda. This report shows the number of displaced persons and their needs in the new sites.

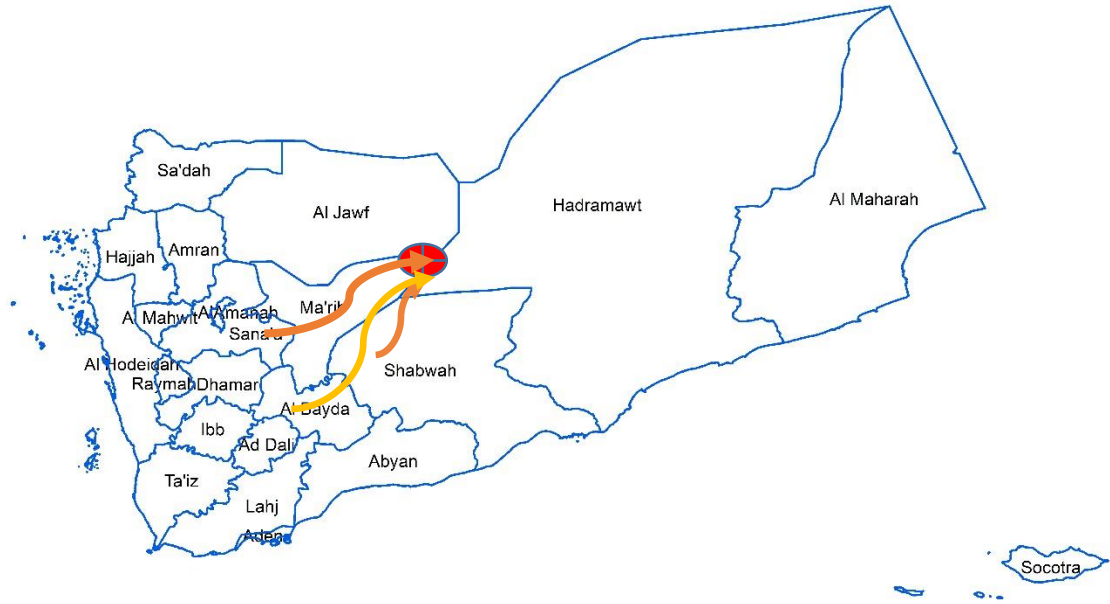

Recommendations

The following is recommended for humanitarian actors:

- The Food Security Cluster should direct the WFP partners to include these displaced persons in the programme.
- The Shelter Cluster should direct partners to respond quickly to cover the rent and NFI needs including tents to the newly displaced persons in the new displacement sites.
- The WASH Cluster should direct the partners to respond quickly to provide water tanks and drinking water in the new displacement sites.
- The Protection Cluster should work to provide multi-purpose cash assistance to help some displaced households pay housing and other rents in the new displacement sites. Also, psychological support is needed.
- Health cluster should intervene to provide mobile clinic and medicines.
- Education cluster should intervene to provide school bags and classrooms
- All the humanitarian clusters and sectors in Yemen are recommended to urgently intervene to rescue these displaced persons and reduce their sufferings.
- The OCHA office is recommended to allocate urgent emergency funds to meet the basic needs of the displaced households in the new displacement sites.
- All NGOs and governmental organizations should intensify their efforts in Al Qatn and Sayun where most of the displaced households are settled.

Conclusion

The current escalations in Marib (Harib and Al Jubah) led to a move of mass displacement. Thousands are leaving Marib because of the current conflict. The Executive Unit for IDPs Camp Management in Hadramaut Governorate registered 211 households with **1899** individuals arrived (displaced) over the period October and November 2021. These 211-household arrived Al Abr in Hadramout. All humanitarian actors should intervene to mitigate the sufferings of the IDPs.



The Executive Unit for IDPs Camp Management Procedures

- ✓ Receiving and monitoring the displaced households.
- ✓ Coordination with the local authorities.
- ✓ Providing lands to settle the displaced households.
- ✓ Informing RRM teams in the new displacement site.
- ✓ Facilitating the work of the RRM teams.
- ✓ Raising a report of the new displacement.
- ✓ Follow-Up is in progress.
