





Feedback received from the community:

- Community members were dissatisfied with disseminating IBV positions announcements in Azraq Camp as not All NGOs announce their opportunities even inside the centre or through VIB.
- Freshly graduated students in the camp were dissatisfied with some of the INGOs requirements for some IBVs opportunities.
- Community members were dissatisfied with the lack of IBV opportunities, and some community members were dissatisfied with the way of applying for some available opportunities, as some of them do not have smartphones to submit through the links.
