



Context

History

Goudoubou was established in October 2012 to host refugees from camps located too close to the border. Goudoubo is an ideal location due to its proximity to Dori as well as far ditance from the Malian border. The camp is one of the three permanent sites and has a capacity to host 21,000 refugees. The camp is organized in blocks, islets and lots.

High number of children in the camp	Plan Burkina has established various child-friendly spaces with education activities.
Lack of wood for cooking	OCADES/Caritas distributes wood and is constructing energy efficient stoves.
Conflict over resources with host communities	Host communities included in the assistance planning thanks to HELP-Germany.
Forced and early marriages	Targetted awareness campaigns for men, adolescents and families introduced.
Refugees living outside of the camp	Danish Refugee Council conducting protection monitoring for refugees living outside of camp and in border regions.
