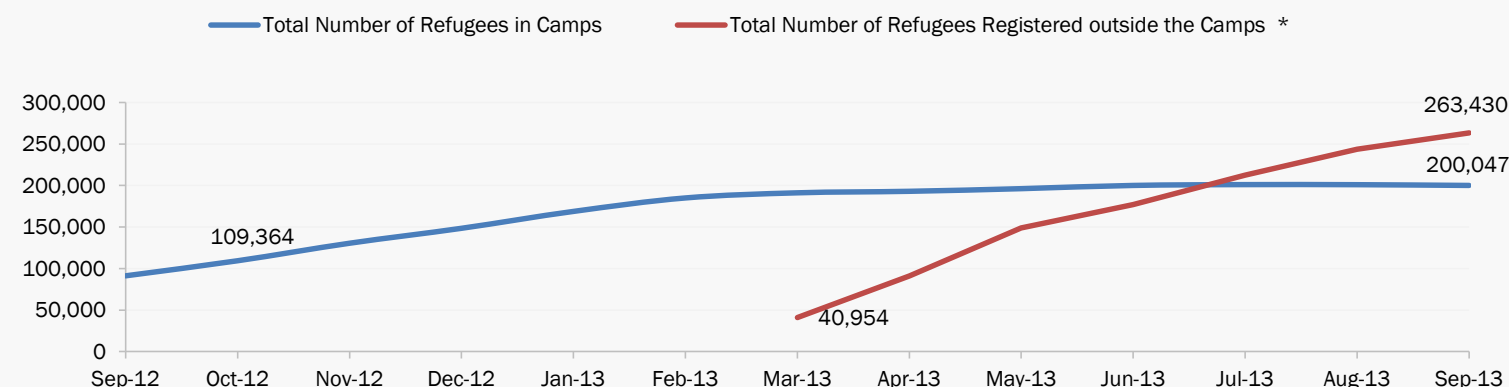

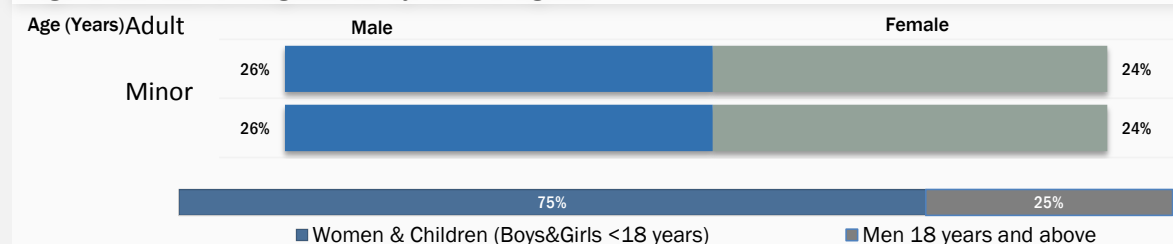

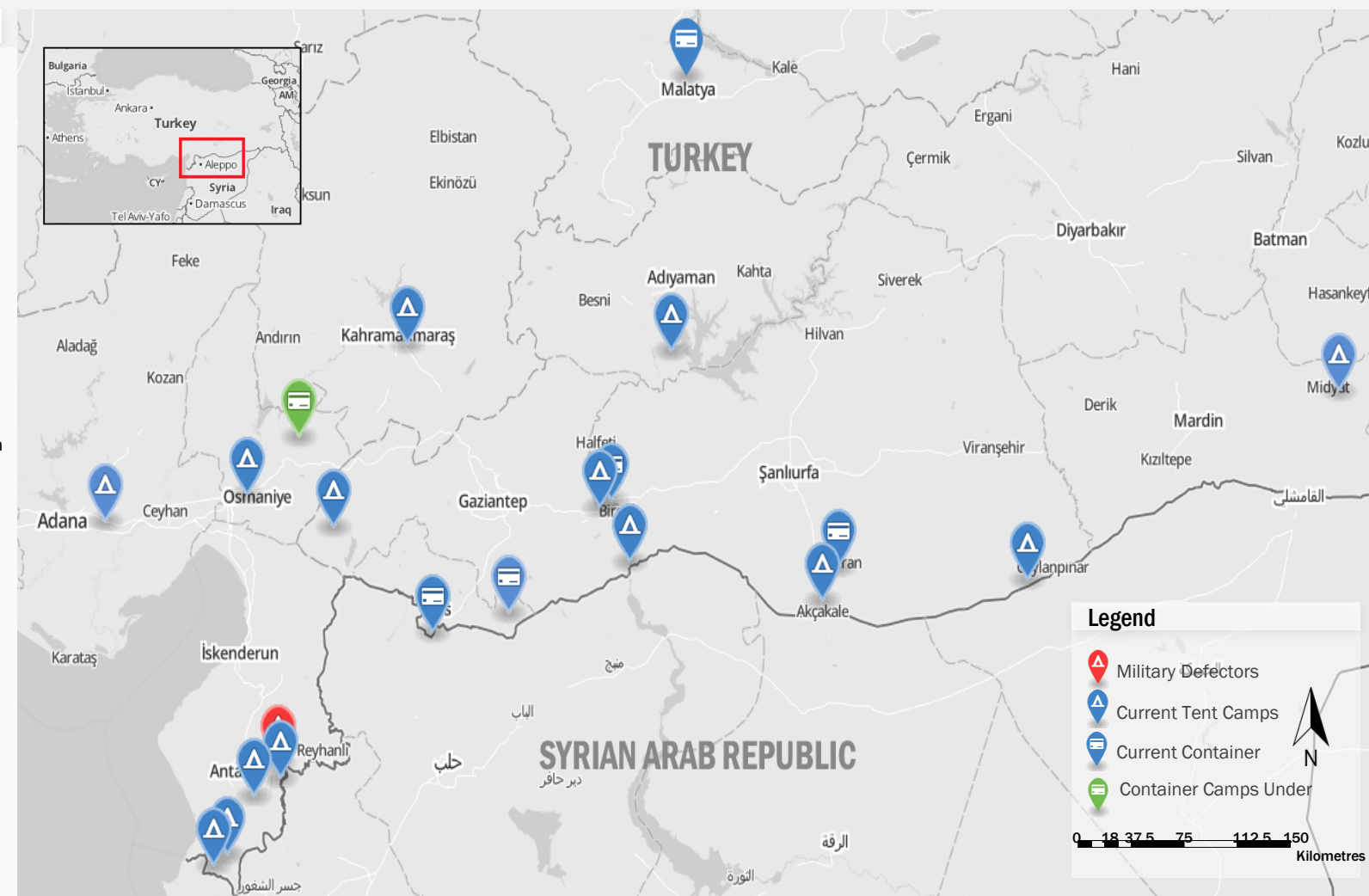


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 06 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,135, including 582 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the weekend 04-06 Oct. 2013, a total of 1,751 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,706 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Sanliurfa and Gaziantep, AFAD Coordination Centers continue to register the non-camp Syrians living in Sanliurfa and Gaziantep provinces. As of 04 Oct 2013, a total of 80,790 non-camp Syrians were registered by the Coordination Center in Gaziantep. The center manager informed UNHCR that the number of persons with appointments decreased to 1,718 and, within the coming week, they will most likely have no-one pending with appointments.
- In Sanliurfa, as of 04 Oct. 2013, a total of 43,435 non-camp Syrians have been registered as living in Sanliurfa center and its towns. Reportedly some 40% of the total registered stated to be living in Sanliurfa city center, 29% living in Akcakale town and the rest in 9 towns. In Sanliurfa, the registered non-camp Syrians are issued an ID card which allows them to have access to medical assistance free of charge and 80% of the cost of their medicines is also covered.
- In Mardin, the registration is being done in the Mardin AFAD office, and as of 26 Sept. 2013, some 37,000 non-camp Syrians were registered. Reportedly 51% of the total registered stated they are living in Kiziltepe town, 46% in Mardin city center, Nusaybin and Midyat towns. The rest (3%) lives in the six towns of Mardin.
- Local officials in Mardin informed UNHCR that in mid-Sep 2013 the General Security Directorate sent an instruction to 20 provinces instructing the Foreigners Police to establish their structure and capacity to take over the registration of non-camp Syrians. Therefore, Mardin AFAD suspended the registration of non-camp Syrians and the police, until the structure and system is in place, is registering only the cases in need of medical assistance in order to issue a document which allows those with medical needs to access hospitals free of charge.
- The registration of the non-camp Syrians in the two main cities (Kilis and Hatay) has not yet started, neither by AFAD nor by the police. However despite the fact of the high mobility, the foreigners police in Hatay continues to enumerate the Syrians through the local administrators (muhtars) in the districts as well as the towns and villages. In Hatay province and its towns, police reported that some more than 61,000 non-camp Syrians were enumerated and 45% of those enumerated stated to be living in Reyhanli and Kirikhan, and 35% are reportedly living in the villages and city center of Antakya. In Kilis local officials estimation is that there are about 40,000 to 45,000 Syrians living in urban and some NGOs who are providing assistance to non-camps Syrians also confirm this number.
