Following a group discussion the following priorities were highlighted for 2016:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Specific group of population: including PWD, LGBTI individuals; • Ensuring engagement of all members of the community, with particular attention to men & boys. • Working on national standards while developing/updating the inter-agency SOP and referral pathways, including all multisectoral services such as clinical management of rape. • Training should focus on including refugees in addition governmental, non-governmental and CBOs. • Safety audit – workshop to come up with ideas to focus on the urban settings. • Further expansion for the GBVIMS • Coordination with other groups should continue, particularly with Health, Protection WGs, CP SWG and thematic Task Forces such as PWD& Youth. <p>Based on the discussions on priorities the SGBV SWG members reviewed the Work Plan 2016.</p>	<p>Members comments to be compiled into a final WP and to be reviewed next meeting for final endorsement.</p>	SGBV SWG coordinators
