## **Key Research Questions**

- 1. What are the links between deteriorating mental health conditions of host communities and refugees, and rising propensities to violence? What are the entry points where youth in particular can be engaged to improve mental health conditions and reduce the likelihood of negative coping mechanisms such as resorting to violence?
- 2. How can the support to local authorities be translated into greater rights-based decision making?
- 3. In what ways could we measure the impact of social stability programming on the wider community, beyond beneficiaries?
- 4. What has been the impact of protection activities on social stability?
- 5. What has been the role of sectors in preventing and mitigating the impact of evictions? Ex. Cash assistance.
- 6. What types of assistance are most effective in mitigating tensions?
