DAILY UPDATE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE-19

As of 29 March 2020, no new countries registered COVID-19. WHO reported confirmed COVID-19, 634 835 (63 159 new) cases and 29 957 (3464 new) deaths, CFR 4.6%.

NB: Songwe and Mbirima borders screened all travellers and non were from high risk countries.




Figure 1: Cumulative people on follow-up for COVID-19 surveillance for Malawi, 29 March 2020

Laboratory testing

Currently we have three laboratories that are testing for COVID-19, National Health Reference Laboratory (NHRL), College of Medicine (COM) Laboratory and Malawi Liverpool Welcome Trust (MLW). Table 2 shows the test counts for each laboratory.

In the past 24 hours, our laboratories received 17 samples that are yet to be tested making the cumulative number of samples 35 to date, 18 were tested and were all negative for COVID-19.
