	<ul> <li>18,000 families out of the 48,000 that were identified do not receive food assistance currently, and they expanded their budget to allocate funds for these families.</li> <li>MoSD will be providing assistance to Jordanian families as well.</li> <li>Additional coordination efforts will include:         <ul> <li>The use of RAIS to avoid any duplication in the assistance provided. There will be advanced booking of cases and the recording of assistance after delivery.</li> <li>Exit strategy is developed as assistance can't be provided indefinitely. Economic recovery indicators were used to develop the strategy.</li> <li>Communication Strategy was developed to ensure everyone was using the same language and the same communication tools to ensure no conflicting information is provided.</li> </ul> </li> <li>UNHCR Contingency Plan (shared as annex)         <ul> <li>UNHCR has developed a contingency plan for the COVID-19 response, which includes multiple sectors and how the response should be done, and it includes multiple sectors and how the collaboration can be done between them.</li> <li>It also includes different ways of how to avoid disruptions of service, including the camps, and acts as a general guidance for the response to the COVID-19 situation.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Refugee Response Updates         <ul> <li>Weekly update provided to the Inter-Agency Coordination Unit that compiles all the responses partners are doing from all the different sectors towards the COVID-19 situation.
