Libya: Activities at Disembarkation, monthly update


July 2020

Libya continues to be a transit point for departure from North Africa towards Europe. UNHCR's interventions at disembarkation points in Libya focus on the provision of life-saving assistance and protection monitoring, to identify persons in need of international protection, as well as vulnerable individuals, such as unaccompanied and separated children, elderly, medical cases, women at risk or victims of trafficking. UNHCR through its partner International Rescue Committee provides medical services and core relief items.


As of 31 July 2020, the Libyan Coast Guard rescued/intercepted a total of 6,439 people in different locations along the Libyan coast. Over the same period last year, the LCG rescued/intercepted a total of 4,542 refugees and migrants at sea. So far in 2020, Libyan local authorities have recovered 12 bodies of people who perished while attempting to cross the Mediterranean towards Europe, while 36 people were reported missing.

Monthly trends - people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2019-2020

From January to July 2020, 6,439 people were rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, an increase of 41.7% compared to the same period in 2019.




Nationalities rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2020




Monthly trends - recorded loss of life in Libyan waters in 2019-2020

From January to July 2020, 12 dead bodies were recovered in Libyan waters, compared to 12 over the same period in 2019. In addition, 36 people were reported missing, compared to 277 in the same months in 2019

Of the total of 6,439 people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, 4,800 were men, 438 women, 415 children and 786 unidentified.


People rescued/intercepted in 2020 by disembarkation point

As of 31 July 2020, UNHCR, through its partner International Rescue Committee*, provided medical assistance to 339 people and distributed 2,028 hygiene kits at disembarkation points.
