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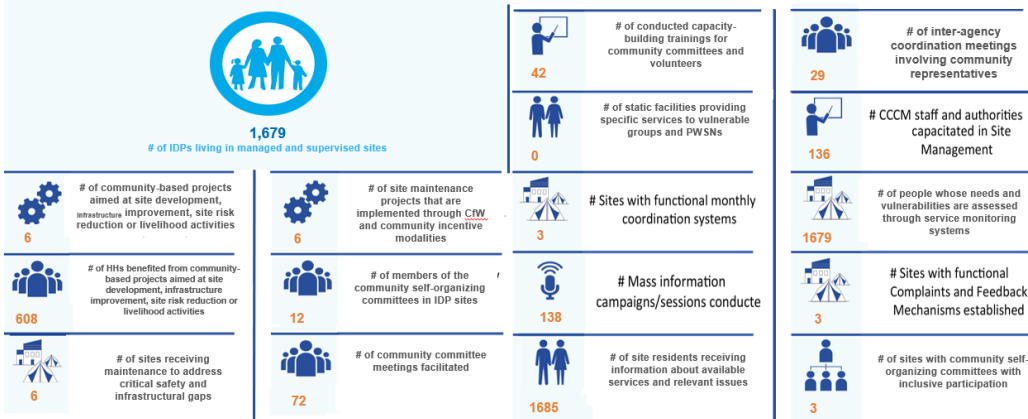

During the meeting, the CCCM SNCC presented the strategy and SOPs of CCCM in Yemen for all CCCM and Protection partners, as well as Protection SNCC presented all the planned interventions in 2022 along with partner(s) presence in each Gov so as to facilitate coordination between CCCM and Protection partners in the field to which can speed up the response to the vulnerable IDPs. In addition, the protection SNCC explained the proper channels the community centres receive the referrals from partners.</p>
