



Shelter Sector

OBJECTIVE

This Gender Monitoring Dashboard is a monitoring tool that provides evidence on to what extent Health Sector benefits equally women, girls, boys, and men [WGBM] refugees under humanitarian programming. It has been developed based on available data/information shared by partners on ActivityInfo and other useful resources as Regional Indicator report, Gender and Age Maps, ISWG and COVID-19 Refugee Response monthly updates, Sector Work Plan, etc.

Data is analysed using several M&E tools: GAM, Availability, Accessibility, Acceptability, and Quality, the Age, Gender and Diversity (AGDs) reflecting differences that may exist between the sexes, clarifications, and thus formulate appropriate recommendations.

With the dashboard information and recommendations, we can refine gender lenses with sector annual planning reflected into the work plan for 2022.

1. Situation of the Sector on Gender

This section clarifies the selection of the sector indicators carefully chosen for this Gender Monitoring Dashboard exercise and the analyses of the figures reflecting the achievement towards any gender category reported (WGBM): totals online ActivityInfo/Dashboard.

The below Indicators were selected in close consultation with the Shelter Sector Coordinators and based on the focus of Shelter repair and Shelter rehabilitation response interventions to Syrian refugees' needs under refugee pillar to provide an example to what extent those interventions/activities were gender lensed. Other resilience indicators under resilience pillar could be selected too but due to time limitations, we have selected 3 indicators to report on in addition to the bulk of funding-supported refugees pillar as indicated in the 3RP Shelter Sector Matrices.

2. Gender Analysis [according to GAM, AGDs, Work Plan...]

The information/data analysed using the following tools:

- Gender with Age Marker (GAM).
- Age and Gender (AG).
- Availability, Accessibility, Acceptability, and Quality.

REF 1.1:

Repairs/rehabilitation - technical selection criteria included the number of family members (10+ receive new caravan, and newlyweds above the age of 18 received new caravan). Additionally, evaluating the status of the caravan as: majorly damaged, moderate damages, and minorly damaged.

REF 2.1:

This indicator aims at monitoring the provision of cash for rent for Syrian refugees and vulnerable Jordanians. The indicator is gender and age-lensed, as it takes into account Women, Girls, Boys, and Men. According to the percentages of the beneficiaries highlighted in the example, we can see that Women, Girls, and Boys are receiving the biggest amount of cash for rent, as they are the most vulnerable group.

Example:

Percentages for short term cash for rent support are as follows:
Women 24.95%
Girls 26.75%
Boys 27.83%
Men 20.48%

REF 2.2:

This project provides Shelter rehabilitation for Syrian refugees and vulnerable Jordanians in the urban areas, to reduce the rent or make it free. As per the provided example, Women, Girls, and Boys are the main beneficiaries of this project, as they are the most vulnerable group. Therefore, we can see that this project is Gender and Age lensed.

Example:

Percentages for shelter rehabilitation services are as follows:
Women 25.58%
Girls 25.91%
Boys 27.52%
Men 20.99%

3. Recommendations [according to GAM & Workplan]

REF 1.1:

The indicators of the project are counting Shelters not beneficiaries, so one recommendation would be to include indicators that break down the age and gender of the households.

REF 2.1:

To continue with the inclusive cash for rent services and achievements. It will be beneficial to apply the same approach while planning for other activities making sure that all groups will benefit from the same services.

REF 2.2:

Indicators can be added to take into account the special needs of Women and Girls when rehabilitating the houses. This includes increased measures of privacy and better access to WASH facilities in the house.
