





The current Burundian refugee situation bagan late April 2015 with the arrival of 210 persons of concern. The following months saw a significantly high number of refugees arriving in Tanzania. The refugees were relocated to Nyarugusu camp. But as the population grew, Nyarugusu's capacity became overwhelmed, giving rise to the need for new location to host the population. Nduta refugee camp was officially opened on 7-Oct-2015 to host Burundians fleeing the situation in their country. With Nduta projected to be able to host slightly below 50,000 individuals, another camp, Mtendeli is being constructed to also host some of the refugees.
