For UASC: UASC TF will prepare, for IM: UNICEF and UNHCR and for CFS: SCI and one more CP partner that participated in the CFS guidelines training. 3 Discussion on • The issue of children at the GFD has been discussed with the the issue of WG members in the presence of the WFP and SCI staff as children and well. **GFD** • WFP has stated that starting from the 1st of September no children are allowed to enter the GFD area, which created angry reactions by most people. • SCI and WFP has stated that children who are entering to collect food say that they donthav ean adult at home to collect food, or that they have vulnerable parents or no older siblings. • The issue raised that they don't have access to data on vulnerable families (access to rice), to discuss means of supporting these children. 4) Updates from WGs and task forces	 Youth task force: QS has a new project funded by OCHA on children in conflict with the law, which addresses 3 categories: those who are at risk of coming into conflict with the law, those who had already in conflict with the law and those who are being released from detention centers. This project is one of its kind in the camp. Pilot project starts Sept. 15th and runs for 6 months. Education WG: School number two and three will open soon, The number of registration in schools vary a lot from time to time depending on the situation in the camp Community mobilization WG: UNWomen hosted a focus group discussion with 15 Syrian women and 6 organizations. IRD briefed the group and circulated notes from the meeting. In general, the women agreed that they want to have a women's committee. The concept paper, in rough draft form, was emailed and hard copies were given to the group along with a draft list of rules and guidelines that should apply to all committees. Organizations are asked to review the documents and contribute their comments. After receiving feedback UNHCR/IRD will come up with a final
