General update

The CCCM team in Dollow supported FSL partners to conduct a registration of new arrivals in 2 sites. The registration was based on a vulnerability assessment conducted by CCCM in March. 5,066 people were registered for food assistance

Eviction risk monitoring is ongoing in Kismayo, Baidoa and Garowe. CCCM teams work closely with protection partners and local authorities to mitigate evictions and support affected families to relocate to new sites.

Service monitoring is ongoing across all sites in Baidoa, Kismayo and Garowe. The site monitoring tool looks to provide key data monthly improving partner responses in IDP sites.and to gauge changes in standards within a site which will allow for clusters/partners to coordinate activities accordingly.


The CCCM Complaints and Feedback Mechanism is operational in Dollow and Baidoa. When a complaint is received, camp management provides feedback to the concerned households and refers to the appropriate service provider as needed.

Camp Management Committee meetings are ongoing with site committees in Garowe, Baidoa and Dollow. CMC meetings, which bring together camp management and the displaced community, help partners better understand and respond to community needs.

The CCCM Cluster in Baidoa co chaired the first meeting for the Relocation Task Force in Baidoa on the 18th of July. The meeting was attended by 45 participants from the regional, state and local government, UN and NGOs. The meeting discussed the overall relocation plan and agreed on the composition of the task force membership. The next meeting will be held in mid August.

- Low levels of community participation and AAP inhibit ability to improve beneficiary targeting to include marginalized populations
