	Katsikas: During the last EWG was flagged the issue of requests from the community of segregating women and men instead of having a common class. After continuous work with the community the issue has been resolved and now women are participating normally in classes conducted by Second Tree. The issue of security concerns that		
• Update on Educational activities on Sites	 were raised are also improved since also the SMS has provided for a private security firm in controlling entry and exit points of the site. The community in Katsikas would like the addition of one more class/ and 1 more teacher. Currently there are two three classes per day. 30 to 40 PoCs, including women participate in the classes. The actors were informed that in Katsikas the Ministry of Education will arrange for the installation of electricity to the kindergarten containers that are already installed but unused since early 2018.
